

NOTICE OF RACE
Falmouth Yacht Club Race to Hyannis
May 24, 2024

1 – Organizing Authority and Event Website

- 1.1 The organizing authority is the Falmouth Yacht Club
- 1.2 The event website is <https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eid=16471>

2 - RULES:

- 2.1 This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)*.

3– ADVERTISING:

The Falmouth Yacht Club Race to Hyannis is designated a “Club Event” in accordance with ISAF Regulation 20, Advertising Code. Advertising is restricted to Category A.

4– ELIGIBILITY:

- 4.1 The Falmouth Yacht Club Race to Hyannis is open to monohull sailboats with a valid 2024 PHRF NE handicap rating.
- 4.1a The Falmouth Yacht Club Race to Hyannis is also open to monohull sailboats with a valid pre-2024 PHRF NE certificate when accompanied with a letter or email stating that no changes or modifications have been made to the boat since they were issued.**
- 4.2 The minimum LOA is 23 feet.
- 4.3 The Maximum PHRF NE racing handicap is 210

5 – ENTRY AND FEES:

- 5.1 Applications are only accepted online, using the Yacht Scoring system. You can access Yacht Scoring at <https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eid=16471>. The entry fee for the Falmouth Yacht Club Race to Hyannis is \$125.00. Make check payable to Falmouth Yacht Club, 290 Clinton Ave, Falmouth Ma. 02540. Twenty five dollars from each entry fee will be donated to “Heroes in Transition” charity in Mashpee, Ma. The deadline for entering the race is 1800 hours, on Wednesday, May 23, 2024.
- 5.2 A copy of a valid 2024 PHRF NE rating certificate must be sent to the FYC General Manager before the deadline for entering the race. The document may be FAXed to 508-540-0889 or sent via email to gm@falmouthyachtclub.com
- 5.3 An entry is considered complete when the online application is complete, the FYC General Manager has received the document described in 5.2, and the entry fee has been paid.
- 5.4 There will be no refunds for any reason, including cancellation of the Falmouth Yacht Club Race to Hyannis, after the deadline described in 5.1.

6 – EQUIPMENT:

All yachts must comply with the current Offshore Racing Council Special Regulations Governing Minimum Equipment and Accommodations Standards for Category 4.

7 – DIVISIONS AND PRIZES:

- 7.1 There will be two divisions – Spinnaker and Non-Spinnaker. At the discretion of the FYC Race Committee, divisions may be broken into classes based on handicap ratings.
- 7.2 Prizes will be awarded according to the number of yachts in each class.
 - 1 – 3 entrants – 1st place
 - 4 – 6 entrants - 1st place and 2nd place
 - 7 or more entrants - 1st place, 2nd place and 3rd place

8 – CHECK-IN, SAILING INSTRUCTIONS AND OFFICIAL NOTICES:

- 8.1 A representative from each yacht must check-in at FYC before the race begins. Check-in hours are as follows:
 - Thursday, 5/23 – 1500 – 2000 hours
 - Friday, 5/24 – 0700 – 0900 hours
- 8.2 Sailing instructions will be included in the Registration Packet, provided at check-in. Sailing Instructions may be posted on the FYC website before the race.
- 8.3 Announcements and amendments to the Sailing Instructions will be posted on the FYC Race Committee bulletin board.

9 – COURSE

- 9.1 Course to be approximately from the mouth of Falmouth Harbor to the mouth of Hyannis Harbor, **leaving Hodges Rock buoy to port**. See **Sailing Instructions** for details.

10 – STARTING AND FINISHING

- 10.1 The Falmouth Yacht Club Race to Hyannis will start in the waters of Vineyard Sound, off FYC.
- 10.2 The finish line for the race will be off the Hyannisport jetty.
- 10.3 The race will be held on Friday, May 24, 2024, with the first warning signal at 1000 hours.
- 10.4 The race will be a pursuit race. A list of individual starting times will be included with the Sailing Instructions in the Registration Packet.

11 – SCORING AND PENALTIES

- 11.1 A yacht's finishing place in the Falmouth Yacht Club Race to Hyannis shall be determined by her corrected time, which is calculated using the current PHRF NE rating.
- 11.2 Because the race is a pursuit race, the order of finish shall determine the final finishing positions.
- 11.3 The penalties defined in RRS 44.1 and 44.2 shall apply. The scoring penalty defined in RRS 44.3 shall not apply.

12 – ARRIVAL, DOCKAGE AND MOORINGS

A **limited** number of moorings and slips in the Falmouth Inner Harbor are available for participants in the Falmouth Yacht Club Race to Hyannis. Reservations for docking at MacDougalls' Cape Cod Marine can be made online. Click the Dockwa URL below to make docking reservations at MacDougalls'. Reservations will open on April 25th and can be booked until May 25th. Contact Falmouth Harbor Master Greg Fraser to make arrangements for docking at the town

marina. Note: Falmouth Harbor town slips are in high demand. They are available on a reservation only basis on DOCKWA starting on **April 1st**. **I strongly encourage you to apply ASAP.**
