

69th BLOCK ISLAND RACE Notice of Race

1. MANAGEMENT

The Storm Trysail Club will hold its Sixty-ninth Annual Block Island Race, May 23, 2014. The Storm Trysail Club is the Organizing Authority for this event.

2. RULES

Racing will be governed by:

- 2.1 The current Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS). If there is one-design racing and there is a conflict between Class Rules and the RRS, Class Rules shall apply.
- 2.2 The US SAILING Prescriptions to the RRS do not apply, except the prescriptions to RRS 61.4, 68, 76.1, and Appendix R.
- 2.3 The current PHRF Regulations as administered by the YRA of Long Island Sound.
- 2.4 The current YRA of LIS Minimum Equipment and Safety Recommendations (see NOR 3.2 and attached Addendum.) These recommendations are also available on the YRA-LIS web site: (www.yralis.org). A copy of these recommendations shall be kept aboard while racing. In the event of a conflict between these recommendations and applicable class rules, the class rules shall apply.
- 2.5 The current IRC Regulations Parts A, B & C. IRC boats equipped **and rated** with water ballast and/or canting keel may use same. This modifies RRS 51.
- 2.5.1 In accordance with IRC Rule 11.2, without an increase in rating, a boat may carry one more spinnaker than shown on her current certificate, if of area not greater than rated SPA.
- 2.5.2 The number of crew allowed shall be the number stated on the certificate plus one.
- 2.6 The NEMA RACE RULES 2014 (available at www.nemasail.org)

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 This event is open to mono-hull boats of no less than 29 feet LOA (except as described in 3.2.3) owned by or under charter to members of yacht clubs or organizations affiliated directly or through regional associations with the United States Sailing Association. The provision for US Sailing affiliation is waived for boats of foreign registry.
- 3.2 Boats sailing the **Block Island Course** shall have self-righting hulls, shall be properly rigged and ballasted, shall be fully seaworthy and shall meet the recommendations set forth in the current YRA of LIS Minimum Equipment and Safety Recommendations for Category A races, with the following additions: (1) Each boat shall have an operating VHF radio capable of transmitting and receiving on Channel 05A; (2) Each boat shall carry at least one cell phone the number of which is on file with the Race Committee and which is kept fully charged while racing.
- 3.2.1 Racing will be conducted in IRC classes, including Double-handed, for boats rating 0.930 and faster.
- 3.2.2 Racing will be conducted in PHRF classes for boats rating 135 seconds/mile or faster. Boats competing in the New England Lighthouse Series shall so indicate on the Entry Form. PHRF ratings shall be those of YRA-LIS (available at www.yralis.org)
- 3.2.3 Mini-650 or Mini Transat Class boats with a minimum crew of two (2) are permitted.
- 3.2.4 Boats may be multihull sailing vessels with a minimum length of 26' LOA, not including bowsprit, and must have a 2014 NEMA Rating Certificate.

- 3.2.5 Racing will be conducted under the 2014 High Performance Racing Rule.
- 3.3 Boats sailing the **Plum Island Course** shall have self-righting hulls, shall be properly rigged and ballasted, shall be fully seaworthy and shall meet the current YRA of LIS Minimum Equipment and Safety Recommendations for Category B races, with the following additions:
 - (1) Each boat shall have an operating VHF radio capable of transmitting and receiving on Channel 05A; (2) Each boat shall carry at least one cell phone the number of which is on file with the Race Committee and which is kept fully charged while racing.
- 3.3.1 Racing will be conducted in PHRF classes, including Double-handed, for boats rated 105 to 174. Minimum number of crew shall be 2.
- 3.4 All entries and payments are to be made on-line at: www.stormtrysail.org by pressing the link "On-Line Entry" or on YachtScoring.com.

4. ENTRY FEES

\$195.00 for completed entries received by 1200 Friday, May 16, 2014. A \$50.00 late fee will apply for entries received after 1200 May 16th. **Absolutely no entry will be accepted after 1800 Wednesday, May 21st.** Entries must be made on line and fees paid by credit card or PayPal. The Race Committee reserves the right to reject any entry.

5. THE COURSES

The specifics of the course will be described in the Sailing Instructions. Generally:

The first signal is scheduled for 1400.

START: Flashing Red Bell "32" (The Cows) off Stamford Harbor.

FINISH: Immediately northerly of the entrance to Stamford Harbor, between the Signal Boat and Green Beacon "3" on the easterly end of the westerly breakwater.

5.1 The Block Island Course

Boats will sail from the Start; leave Block Island to starboard, to the Finish, leaving Red Bell "32" (The Cows) and Red Nun 1 to starboard. Course distance is 186 NM.

5.2 The Plum Island Course

Boats will sail from the Start; leave the Red & White Whistle "PI" (Plum Island) to starboard, and to the Finish as described above. Course distance is 126 NM.

5.3 At the discretion of the race committee, for the Block Island Course a short course may be signaled by displaying code flag "C" prior to the Preparatory Signal for the first Block Island Course start. The short course shall be the Plum Island Course.

6. SCORING

- 6.1 PHRF classes will be scored using YRA-LIS PHRF Distance Ratings and computed time-on-time.
- 6.2 The IRC classes will be scored using the IRC Time Correction Factor using time on time.
- 6.3 HPR boats will be scored using HPR Ratings.
- 6.4 Multihulls will be scored using either NEMA or Portsmouth Ratings, depending on entries.
- 6.5 Teams will be scored by using the average of each team member's percentage placement in its respective class.
- 6.5 In the event the Regatta Committee elects to include a one-design class or group of boats racing level on a start with other boats, the one-design or level rating group may be scored separately.

7. PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded at a cocktail reception at 1700 on Sunday May 25th at Stamford Yacht Club. A Team Race Trophy will be awarded to the club whose team compiles the best score. A team shall consist of three boats whose owners are members of the same yacht club regardless of the class in which each boat sails. Teams shall not have more than 2 boats sailing in the same class. In order to be scored for the Team Racing Trophy, each team must submit a Team Application to the Storm Trysail office prior to 1800 Thursday, May 22nd.

The STC Perpetual prizes will be described in the Sailing Instructions and will also be awarded.

NOTE: The Block Island Race is a qualifier for the Northern Ocean Racing Trophy (IRC), the Double Handed Ocean Racing Trophy (IRC), the New England Lighthouse Series (PHRF) and the Gulf Stream Series Trophy (IRC). For more details consult the YRA Handbook or www.stamfordyc.com. The Block Island Race is also a qualifier for the Caper, Sagola and Windigo trophies awarded by the YRA of Long Island Sound and the "Tuna Trophy" for the best IRC combined scores in the EDLU (40%) and the Block Island Race (60%)

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available on the Storm Trysail Club web site www.stormtrysail.org, on YachtScoring, and at the front desk at Stamford Yacht Club, 97 Ocean Drive West, Stamford, CT 06902.

9. PROTESTS

A Protest Committee appointed by the Organizing Authority will decide protests. Protests involving potential trophy winners will be heard at Stamford Yacht Club, as soon as practicable after the boats involved have finished.

10. CHANGES TO THE NOTICE OF RACE

All changes to the Notice of Race will be posted on the Storm Trysail website (<u>www.stormtrysail.org</u>) no later than 1200, May 16th.

11. LIABILITY

The Skipper/Owner of each boat participating in the Block Island Race shall be responsible for the behavior of each member of the crew of his/her boat – both on the water and while ashore. The destruction of property, the breach of reasonable standards of good sportsmanship by any crew member, or any other person associated with the boat, or the failure of any of those persons to comply with any reasonable request of any Race Officer, Regatta Committee member, or their representatives, may result in the disqualification of the boat, and it's exclusion from the regatta.

12. SAFETY REGULATIONS

In order to ensure that safety requirements are being, or were, met, it is <u>recommended</u> that all boats check in with the Race Committee by sailing in proximity thereto and with storm jib and either double-reefed main or storm trysail flying. All boats are strongly encouraged to follow the STC Safety Guidelines and the Guidelines for Rendering Assistance. These guidelines are available on the Storm Trysail website: (<u>www.stormtrysail.org</u>), and a copy of which shall be kept aboard while racing. The Organizing Authority may make inspections of boats at any time prior to the awarding of prizes.
