

NEW YORK YACHT CLUB QUEEN'S CUP September 27, 2020

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1 RULES

- 1.1 The Queen's Cup will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The Conditions for the Queen's Cup, as listed in Notice of Race Addendum 1 Queen's Cup Conditions, shall apply.
- **1.3** The current ORC rules shall apply.
 - a) ORC Rule 200.1 is changed as follows:
 - i) The combined weight of all crew members, weighed in wearing at least shorts and a shirt, who are on board while racing shall not be greater than the maximum crew weight as defined in ORC 102.1 and 102.2.
 - ii) Children under age 16 do not count against the weight limit.
 - iii) Crews are not required to weigh-in; however, if a boat is later protested for exceeding her maximum crew weight, the person in charge shall make all crew available to be weighed in prior to any protest hearing.
- 1.4 All yachts shall minimally comply with the US Nearshore section of the USSER as changed in Notice of Race Addendum 2 US Safety Equipment Requirements.
- 1.5 The protest committee may impose suitable penalties, other than disqualification, for violations of the USSER or non-Part 2 rules. This changes RRS 64.1.
- 1.6 The Two-Minute Starting Window is described in SI 7.1 below.
- 1.7 Except in the case of emergency or by specific permission of the Race Committee, the helmsperson shall be a Group 1 competitor as defined in World Sailing Regulation 22, WS Sailor Classification Code.

2 COMMUNICATIONS: NOTICES, ANNOUNCEMENTS, VHF CHANNEL, SIGNALS ASHORE

- Notices, including race documents, results and amendments, shall be posted on the online Official Notice Board on the event webpage: https://nyyc.org/2020-queens-cup.
- 2.2 Flag signals will be flown from the western yardarm of the flagpole at Harbour Court.
- 2.3 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on Sunday, September 27, except that any change to the schedule of racing will be posted by 1900 on Saturday, September 26. Flag "Lima" will be flown to signify such posting.
- When "AP" is displayed ashore, "one minute" is replaced with "not less than one hour" in Race Signal "AP".
- 2.5 The Race Committee will make an announcement at 1100 on VHF channel 72. The announcement will include the rendezvous location and any other relevant information. The Race Committee Signal Boat will continue to monitor and communicate on VHF channel 72.

3 SCHEDULE OF RACES



4 RACING AREA

The racing area is Rhode Island Sound or Narragansett Bay. The rendezvous location will be described by the Race Committee in its 1100 announcement.

5 COURSES

- 5.1 No later than the warning signal, the Race Committee will signal the course on a course board.
- 5.2 COURSE W, K or O:
 - W2 Start -1 Finish (downwind)
 - W3 Start -1-3 Finish (upwind)
 - W4 Start -1-3-1 Finish (downwind)
 - W5 Start -1-3-1-3 Finish (upwind)
 - W6 Start -1-3-1-3-1 Finish (downwind)
 - K Start -1-2-3-1 Finish (downwind)
 - O Start -1-2-3-1-3 Finish (upwind)
- **5.3 COURSE W, K or O:** The leeward mark 3 will be set approximately 0.1 NM to windward of the starting line.
- **5.4 COURSE W, K or O:** The course designation, distance and bearing to the windward mark will be displayed on a board.
- **5.5 COURSE W, K or O:** Marks shall be rounded in order and left to port.
- **5.6 COURSE W, K or O:** Course diagrams:



- **5.7 COURSE 1:** If number "1" is displayed, the course will be designated using buoys as described in SI 6.4, 6.5, and 6.6. The Race Committee will list the marks in the order to be rounded and the required side to leave each mark.
- **5.8 COURSE 1:** All yachts shall pass through the center span only for any course passing under the Jamestown Verrazano Bridge and/or the Newport Jamestown Bridge, in which case the center span bridge piers define a gate mark.
- 5.9 Government marks shall have no required side except when designated as a rounding mark.

- 6 MARKS
- **6.1 COURSE W, K or O:** Mark 1, mark 2 and mark 3 (if used) marks will be orange tetrahedron buoys.
- **6.2 COURSE W, K or O:** New marks, as provided in SI 10, will be yellow tetrahedron buoys.
- **6.3 ALL COURSES:** The starting mark and finishing mark will be a pink buoy.
- **6.4 COURSE 1:** All buoys listed on the current *South Bay Race Chart* may be used.
- **COURSE 1:** If used, Special NYYC Temporary Inflatable Race Marks 16 and 17 as designated on the current South Bay Race Chart will be orange tetrahedron buoys.
- **6.6 COURSE 1:** Special Mark "E"
 - a) The Race Committee may add a new first mark "E" to Course 1.
 - b) If special mark "E" is used, the Race Committee will list "E" as the first mark on the course board as described in SI 5.7.
 - c) The magnetic bearing and distance to special mark "E" will be posted on a whiteboard on the Race Committee signal boat.
 - d) Special mark "E" will be a yellow tetrahedron buoy.

7 THE START

- 7.1 Races will be started using rule 26, except that the <u>actual time</u> of the start of any yacht starting within two minutes after the starting signal will be taken and used to calculate elapsed time. All yachts starting after that will be timed as starting at the expiration of two minutes from the starting signal. This changes rules 26 and A3.
- 7.2 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee Signal Boat and either a staff displaying an orange flag on the port-end Race Committee boat or the course side of the starting mark.

8 INDIVIDUAL RECALLS

The Race Committee will endeavor to hail boats observed to be OCS at the start over VHF channel 72 and/or by voice. Failure to hail, the timing or order of any such hails, will not be grounds for a request for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

9 RETIRING FROM A RACE

Yachts retiring from a race are requested to notify the Race Committee on VHF channel 72. If unable to reach the Race Committee by VHF radio, a yacht shall contact the Sailing Office at 401-845-9633.

10 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

To change the next leg of the course, the Race Committee will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line) and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.

11 THE FINISH

- 11.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on a Race Committee Boat and the course side of the finishing mark.
 - a) For course "W", with an odd number of legs, and course "O", the finish line will be located approximately 0.1 NM to windward of the windward mark.
 - b) For course "W", with an even number of legs, and course "K", the finish line will be located approximately 0.1 NM to leeward of the leeward mark.
 - c) For course "1", the finish line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the Race Committee boat and the nearby finishing mark. Note that the intended finishing line will be set at the starting location of the Race Committee signal boat.
- 11.2 If there is fog at the finish, the Finish Line Committee Boat may ring a bell rapidly, for approximately five seconds, at intervals.

11.3 Special Finish Mark "F"

If flag "F" is displayed on a separate pole, the finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on a Race Committee boat and a pink finishing mark approximately 0.4 NM north of the Fl R 6 sec Horn "2" on the northern point of Fort Adams. In the absence of the Race Committee boat and/or

finishing mark, the finishing line will be on a bearing of 120° M from G "3" Gong southeast of Rose Island. This changes SI 5.2, SI 5.6.



12 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 12.1 The Scoring Penalty, rule 44.3 will apply. In accordance with rule 44.3, a yacht taking a penalty shall keep the yellow flag displayed until finishing and call the Race Committee's attention to it at the finishing line and inform the Race Committee of the identity of the other boat involved in the incident.
- 12.2 The penalty will be two places. This changes RRS 44.3.
- 12.3 A yacht that has taken a penalty shall complete an online penalty acknowledgement form available on the Queen's Cup website.
- 12.4 The protest committee may impose suitable penalties, other than disqualification, for breaches of any non-Part 2 rule. This changes rule 64.1(a).

13 TIME LIMIT

In accordance with the Queen's Cup Deed of Gift, there is no time limit.

14 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 14.1 The intent to protest and the boat being protested shall be communicated to the Race Committee at the first reasonable opportunity after the boat intending to protest finishes until acknowledged by the Race Committee. This changes RRS 61.1(a).
- 14.2 Written protests or requests for redress shall be submitted through the online protest form as soon as possible, but not later than one hour after the Race Committee signal boat has docked. The time limit for filing a protest will be posted on the online Official Notice Board.

15 SCORING

One race is scheduled.

16 PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded as stated in the Notice of Race.
