- City Island Cup racers that belong to the same club or organization can form a team with two to three boats.
- All the skippers of the team boats must be members of the same club or organization they represent.
- At least one boat of the two or three boat team must be entered in a spinnaker division. The other boat(s) may register spinnaker or non-spinnaker.
- Team Challenge boats will be identified on the scratch sheet by "(TC)" next to their club affiliation.
- Team Challenge Boats shall fly "Charlie" flag on their backstay.
- In each race of the series, the two highest finish scores of each team's boats will be used as the team score for that race.
- Each team's score for each race will be used to calculate a cumulative team score. Highest team cumulative score wins the Team Challenge.
- Team Challenge will be scored separately from the Low Point system used to score the CIC. Because of disparate division sizes, Cox-Sprague scoring will be used to figure cumulative Team results.
- The Team Challenge calculation disregards the finish from the lowest finishing boat on each team in that race, using the two highest finish scores. If there are only two boats on a team both finish scores must be used. Having a three-boat team is more advantageous than a having a two-boat team.
- The City Island Cup Team Challenge award will be presented at the EBYRA awards Dinner in early December.
