Sailing instructions

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by *The Racing Rules of Sailing* except as altered by the Sailing Instructions.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the "Official Notice Board" located at the Port Clinton Yacht Club main entrance.

3 CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Any changes in the Sailing Instructions will be posted before 0800 on the day it will take effect.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the Yardarm on the riverfront.
- 4.2 When flag 'AP' is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced by "not less than 30 minutes" in race signal AP. This changes the RRS.

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 Races are scheduled as follows:

- 5.2 The Race Committee will attempt to maintain 5-minute rolling starts.

- 5.3 Before the warning signal of the first race each day, boats shall sail past the stern of the Race Committee signal boat and hail her sail number until acknowledged by the Race Committee.

7 RACING AREA

7.1 The racing area will be the western basin of Lake Erie, north of the Port Clinton Yacht Club.

8 THE COURSES

8.1 The starting & finishing line will be north of the Portage River harbor light, dependent on wind conditions as determined by the PRO. The J/24 Class will compete in the J-24 District 12 Championship on a separate course.

8.2 Please refer to the attached course diagram.

9 MARKS

9.1 Marks will be yellow.

9.2 New marks will be orange.

9.3 The starting and finishing marks will be yellow.

10 THE START

10.1 Races will be started using *Rule 26* with classes starting in the order designated in section 6 of the Sailing Instructions.

10.2 The original starting order and class starts will be maintained after postponement. In the event of a general recall, the recalled class will start after the scheduled starts.

10.3 The starting line will be between the orange flag on the Race Committee Signal boat and the yellow starting mark.

10.4 A 'Limiting' mark may be set by the Race Committee behind the transom of the Race Committee Signal Boat. Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall stay clear of the starting area.

11 THE FINISH

11.1 The 'Finish' line will be blue flag on the Race Committee Signal boat and a yellow finish mark.

12 TIME LIMITS

12.1 The time limit for each race will be 2 hours after class start.

12.2 Boats failing to finish within the time limit will be scored 'Did Not Finish' (**DNF**). This changes rule 35 and A4.1

13 PROTESTS AND REQUEST FOR REDRESS

13.1 Protest forms are available at the registration desk. Protests shall be delivered to the Principal Race Officer within the protest time limit.

13.2 The protest time limit is 30 minutes after the Race Committee Signal Boat docks.

13.3 The same time limit applies to all protests by the Race Committee and to requests for redress.

13.4 Protest notices will be posted within 10 minutes of the protest time limit (on the 'Official Notice Board') to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the Port Clinton Yacht Club beginning at the close of the protest time limit.

14 SCORING

14.1 The Low Point scoring system of Appendix A of the RRS will apply. The time on distance handicapping system will be used. There are no throw-outs (this changes Appendix A of the RRS).

14.2 A minimum of three (3) boats are required to constitute a fleet for each class.

14.3 One race constitutes a regatta.

15 SAFETY REGULATIONS

15.1 A boat that retires from racing shall notify the Race Committee as soon as possible on CH 71.

16 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

16.1 A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with class rules and sailing instructions.

17 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

17.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, "Decision to Race". The Organizing Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

18 INSURANCES

18.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with adequate coverage amounts.

18.2 If a Race Committee boat is damaged as a result of a boat breaking a rule that boat shall pay for the repairs.

18 Communication

19.1 All official race communications will be on VHF channel 71.
