





NOTICE OF RACE

THE ORGANIZING AUTHORITY (DA) FOR THIS REGATTA IS SAILING WORLD IN COOPERATION WITH THE ST. PETERSBURG YACHT CLUB (SPYC). THIS IS A US SAILING SANCTIONED EVENT.

THE NOTATION '[DP]' IN A RULE IN THIS NOTICE OF RACE MEANS THAT THE PENALTY FOR A BREACH OF THAT RULE MAY, AT THE DISCRETION OF THE PROTEST COMMITTEE, BE LESS THAN DISQUALIFICATION.

1. RULES

- **1.1** The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- **1.2** All boats are required to abide by the state and local laws, guidelines and recommendations as well as the host club's restrictions with regard to the COVID-19 virus. Links to these documents will be posted on the Official Notice Board https://yachtscoring.com/notice_board_summary.cfm?eid=14800 as they become available. [DP]
- **1.3** For the J70 Class: Class Rules Part III Sections I.3 (Support Boat) and I.4 (Corinthian Division) will apply. [DP]
- **1.4** The US Sailing Prescriptions to RRS 63.1 and 63.2 shall not apply.
- **1.5** RRS Rule 55, prohibiting the practice of allowing bands on spinnakers to fall in the water (even if the material used is biodegradable), will be in effect. The Florida Department of Environmental Protection has confirmed that this practice breaks Florida law.
- **1.6** For the J/88 Class: Competitors are not required to carry all of the sails described in C.R. 5.3. However, once a competitor leaves shore for the final time before the first race of the day, no sail may be added, removed or substituted during the event unless it is lost or damaged beyond what could reasonably be repaired overnight. In this case the sail may be replaced with the same type (as defined in C.R. Appendix A) for subsequent days.

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- **2.1** Sailing Instructions will be posted on the Official Notice Board immediately prior to the event.
- 2.2 Amendments to the Sailing

Instructions will be posted on the Official Notice Board located on the race website It is the responsibility of each competitor to check the Official Notice Board for any amendments or notices.

- **2.3** Separate Sailing Instructions (SIs) will be available for the Distance Race.
- **2.4** Class breaks will be published as an Addendum to the SI.

3. COMMUNICATION

- **3.1** The Official Notice Board is located online.
- **3.2** [DP] All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on US channels. This may change a class rule.
- **3.3** On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the Si's.
- **3.4** [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- **4.1** The following boats are eligible to enter: a) member of a one-design class association that has been invited to this regatta and b) boats that meet criteria established by the class coordinator for a level class. A minimum of six boats is required for a class to remain eligible for one-design/level class section. There is a possibility that classes with fewer than 12 boats registered may be started together, but scored separately. The OA reserves the right to invite additional classes at its sole discretion.
- **4.2** Potential classes: A Cats, J/70, J/24, J/88, J/111, Lightning, L30, Melges 15, Melges 24, RS 21, S2 7.9, Sonar, Thistle, Viper 640, VX One, and ORC. If your Class is not listed, please email regattas@sailingworld.com to propose inclusion in the event.
- **4.3** ORC Spinnaker Class is open to any boat of 20 feet LOA or greater that holds a current valid ORC certificate. A boat sailing under ORC shall be assigned to a division and section according to its rating and at the discretion of the organizing authority. All decisions of the

OA regarding section assignments shall be final. Certificates can be acquired here: ussailing.org/competition/offshore/orc.

- **4.4** The regatta is open to those boats whose Owner and/or Skipper is a current member of their National Governing Body (US Sailing for USA members; to join go online to www. ussailing.org).
- **4.5** Entries shall be completed online at the St. Petersburg Sailing World Regatta Series page: https://www.sailingworld.com/helly-hansen-nood-regattas/
- **4.6** Classes shall meet eligibility requirements no later than February 1, 2022. New and incomplete entries after February 1, 2022 will increase by \$75.00, this includes any unpaid entries.
- **4.7** A representative of each eligible boat shall check in with race management in person at the St. Petersburg Yacht Club before racing starts. All skipper and crew waivers must be completed before Check in.
- **4.8** Crew lists and waivers of liability must be submitted online by the close of registration on February 17. 2022. In order to complete the waiver online, skippers will need to complete the Crew List in the "Owner's Corner". Subsequently, individual crew members will be notified by email of their boat's entry and those crew members must follow up when notified in order to complete the waiver. A boat's registration will not be final without a completed waiver from each participating crew member. A boat will not be scored without completing ALL registration requirements.
- **4.9** In the event of a crew member substitution during the regatta, the new crew member must submit a signed waiver of liability online prior to racing on that boat.
- **4.10** For Entries to be considered valid, all registration items must be completed including but not limited to crew waiver submission, paid fees, rating certificates submitted, etc. All incomplete registrations will be considered withdrawn from the regatta if incomplete on or after 1900 on

4.11 A Regatta entrant may participate in the Distance Race on Saturday, February 19, 2022 (see separate NOR) by contacting the OA prior to February 1, 2022. No additional entry fee will

apply. That Distance Race competitor will be scored DNC for Saturday's Regatta races.

4.12 An entire one-design fleet may compete in the Distance Race if the fleet captain informs the organizing

authority in writing of its decision no later than February 1, 2022. The Distance Race results will be scored as part of that fleet's Regatta.

5.2 The entry fee includes the costs for race management, access to SPYC Club

5. FEES

5.1 The entry fee will be based on the LOA as follows:

- **5.3** Entries may be accepted solely at the discretion of the OA. An entry is not valid until the entry form and fees are accepted by the organizing authority. To withdraw your entry, please email regattas@sailingworld.com no later than February 7, 2022. In the event that the regatta is canceled all entry fees will be credited in full.
- **5.4** Social events and fees are separate

from entry fees; all sailors, members, and their guests are welcome. It is the intent of the OA to host a two-hour Happy Hour post racing on Friday, Saturday and Sunday at St. Petersburg Yacht Club on the 2nd Floor Pool Patio and SPYC Ballroom. Weekend Social Passes can be purchased in advance for \$50 per person and include access to the Happy Hour with beverages sponsored by Mount Gay Rum and Regatta Craft Mixers.

5.5 Due to possible state and local social restrictions due to the pandemic, Regattas and St. Petersburg Yacht Club reserves the right to limit capacity,

amend the social events and associated guidelines, and provide refunds if canceled. Information about social events and pass prices will be posted on the event website.

6. ADVERTISING

- **6.1** Boats are urged to refrain from displaying advertisements for businesses or products competing with those of the primary and support sponsors of the event.
- **6.2** Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the OA, e.g., bow stickers, bow numbers, boom stickers, and/or flags.
- **6.3** At the discretion of the OA, bow numbers may also be required for some classes. If required, they will be provided and shall be placed on both sides of the boat's bow.

7. SCHEDULE OF RACES

7.1 A Competitors' Meeting will be held at 1830 on February 17, 2022 at SPYC. **7.2** The first warning signal is scheduled for 1000 each day. There will be no

warning signal after 1400 on Sunday. No Warning Signal for the A-Cat and Lightning Classes will be made prior to 1200 on Friday, February 18, 2022. This change only applies to A-Cat and Lightning racing on Friday. The race committee intends to run as many races as viable each day.

8. MEASUREMENT/WEIGH-IN

8.1 Measurement is not required, but each boat shall submit proof of holding a valid measurement certificate at registration if required by the class.

8.2 Neither the OA nor the SPYC shall be responsible for conducting or administrating weigh-ins or measurements. Local or national class association representatives shall be responsible for conducting weigh-ins and/or measurement if needed.

9. VENUE

Racing areas will be in Tampa Bay, East of the harbor entrance.

10. COURSES

Courses will be windward/leeward, triangle, or a variation of those. The number of racing areas, specific locations, and courses to be sailed will be provided in the Sailing Instructions. Class/Racing area assignments are subject to entries received.

11. PENALTY SYSTEM

11.1 RRS Appendix T- ARBITRATION, will apply

11.2 US Sailing Prescription Appendix V1 - PENALTY AT THE TIME OF AN INCIDENT, will apply.

12. SCORING

Each boat's series score will be the sum of her scores for all races with no race scores excluded. One race will constitute a series.

13. BERTHING/HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

13.1 Boats may be moored at the SPYC or the St. Petersburg Sailing Center, as assigned, February 17 - 20, 2022, free of charge. Boats wishing to arrive earlier

or depart later, should contact the SPYC dock master at 727-822-3227 to make reservations.

13.2 Once launched, boats shall not be hauled out for the duration of the regatta without written permission from the OA. Boats stored on local beaches are exempt from these haul-out restrictions. [DP]

13.3 Boats exceeding 6,000 pounds and/or draft of 7 feet or more may contact Sailor's Wharf, for launch and haul out services, at 727-823-1155.

14. RISK STATEMENT

14.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. The OA and SPYC will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta. **14.2** The Skipper/Owner of each

boat participating in the regatta shall be responsible for the behavior of each member of the crew of his/ her boat both on the water and while ashore. The destruction of property, the breach of reasonable standards of good sportsmanship by any crew member, or any other person associated with the boat, or the failure of any of those persons to comply with the state and local laws, guidelines and recommendations as well as the host club's restrictions or with any reasonable request of the Organizing Authorities, Race Officers, Regatta Committee members, or their representatives, may result in the disqualification of the boat, and its exclusion from the regatta.

14.3 It is the skipper's obligation to ensure that each crew member's waiver is reflected on the waiver list prior to closing of on-site registration and check-in.

15. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$500,000 per incident or the equivalent. Competitors shall be prepared to supply proof of insurance upon request by the OA.

16. PRIZES

16.1 Prizes will be awarded, after racing on Sunday, to the top three finishers of each qualifying class.

16.2 Each class winner is eligible for the 2022 Helly Hansen Caribbean Championship. The designated Challenger will be drawn at the conclusion of the event.

16.3 Additional prizes may be awarded to the top Junior Team (under 21 years of age), and top Mixed Plus Team (50% + female) to the J/70 Class or any one-design class with a minimum of 12 boats registered.

17. PHOTOGRAPHERS AND TV RIGHTS

Competitors give absolute right and permission to the OA for any photographs or video footage taken of themselves or their competing boat to be published in any media whatsoever; for either editorial or advertising purposes, or to be used in press information.

18. ENVIRONMENTAL




COURSE LOCATION CHART

- 1.2 All boats are required to abide by the state and local laws, guidelines and recommendations as well as the host club's restrictions with regard to the COVID-19 virus. Links to these documents will be posted on the Official Notice Board https://yachtscoring.com/notice_board_summary.cfm?eid=14800 as they become available. [DP]
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- **1.4** The US Sailing Prescriptions to RRS 63.1 and 63.2 shall not apply.
- **1.5** RRS Rule 47, prohibiting the practice of allowing bands on spinnakers to fall in the water (even if the material used is biodegradable), will be in effect. The Florida Department of Environmental Protection has confirmed that this practice breaks Florida law.
- **1.6** For the J/88 Class: Competitors are not required to carry all of the sails described in C.R. 5.3. However, once a competitor leaves shore for the final time before the first race of the day, no sail may be added, removed or substituted during the event unless it

is lost or damaged beyond what could reasonably be repaired overnight. In this case the sail may be replaced with the same type (as defined in C.R. Appendix A) for subsequent days.

1.7 Social events and fees. Due to unpredictable social restrictions due to the pandemic, Sailing World Regatta Series D Regattas and SPYC are unable to commit to a social schedule or fees at this time. Information about social events and ticket prices will be posted on the event website.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board located on the race website at https://www.sailingworld.com/helly-hansen-nood-regatta-st-petersburg/. It is the responsibility of each competitor to check the Official Notice Board for any amendments or notices.

3. CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change in the sailing instructions will be posted before 0800 on the day it will take effect, except that any change in the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- **4.1** Signals made ashore will be flown from the yardarm at the St. Petersburg Yacht Club. Flag AP (Answering Pennant), with two sounds (one sound when lowered) means "The race is postponed. Do not leave the harbor area.". The first warning signal will be made not less than 60 minutes after the AP is lowered. This changes Race Signals AP.
- **4.2** When the AP is flown with a division flag, the AP applies only to that division. When no division flag is flown the AP applies to all divisions. Division flags are as follows:

Division A - Pink with an 'A' Division B - Blue with a 'B' Division C - Purple with a 'C' Division D - Green with a 'D'

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- **5.1** The first warning signal is scheduled for 1000 each day. There will be no warning signal after 1400 on Sunday.
- **5.2** No Warning Signal for the A-Cats, Thistles & or the Lightning Class will be made prior to 1200 on Friday February 18. This change only applies to A-Cats, Thistles, and Lightning classes racing on Friday.
- **5.3** The race committee intends to run as many races as viable each day.

6. DIVISION ASSIGNMENT, INITIAL STARTING ORDER AND CLASS FLAGS

All will be posted on the Official Notice Board.

7. COURSES

- **7.1** Windward/Leeward and Triangle Courses (see course diagrams)
- **7.2** The course number, approximate compass bearing, and distance from the starting line to the first windward mark will be displayed from the race committee signal boat for each division. Except when passing through a gate, all rounding marks shall be passed to port.
- **7.3** An Offset Mark, Mark 1a (a small orange tomato), will be placed approximately 75 yards from mark 1 perpendicular to the course axis (see the diagrams).
- **7.4** The leeward mark will be a gate. In the event where there is only one leeward mark, it shall be rounded to port.

8. MARKS

8.1 The starting marks will be race committee boats at each end of the

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starting line. In the event that the port-end line race committee boat is not in place, it will be replaced with an inflatable buoy.

- **8.2** For Division A, original turning marks will be an orange tetrahedron with a small orange ball as the windward offset. The starting mark may be an orange ball. The finishing mark will be a yellow inflatable mark. Change marks (see SI 10 and 11) will be yellow tetrahedrons.
- **8.3** For Division B, original windward mark and offset will be red Helly Hansen tomatoes and original leeward marks will be orange tetrahedrons. The starting mark may be an orange ball. The finishing mark will be a yellow inflatable mark. Change marks (see SI 10 and 11) will be yellow tetrahedrons with the offset of a small orange ball.
- **8.4** For Division C, original windward mark and offset will be red Helly Hansen tetrahedrons and leeward marks will be yellow tetrahedrons. The starting mark may be an orange tomato. The finishing mark will be a yellow inflatable mark. Change marks (see SI 10 and 11) will be green tetrahedrons with the offset of a small orange ball.
- **8.5** For Division D, original turning marks will be green tetrahedron with a small orange ball as the windward offset. The starting mark may be an orange ball. The finishing mark will be a yellow inflatable mark. Change marks (see SI 10 and 11) will be orange tetrahedrons with the offset of a small orange ball.
- **8.6** When in a subsequent change of course a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced with an original mark.

9. THE START

9.1 A boat starting more than 5 minutes after her starting signal will be scored DNS without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1, A4.1, and A5.

9.2 The race committee will attempt

to broadcast any boat recalled. Division A will broadcast on VHF channel 68, Division B on VHF channel 69, Division C on VHF channel 72, and Division D will broadcast on VHF Channel 05. Failure to hear, timing of the broadcast, order of the broadcast is not ground for redress.

10. CHANGE OF THE FIRST LEG OF THE COURSE (DURING A STARTING SEQUENCE)

The race committee may signal a change of the first leg of the course for a class as follows: At the preparatory signal, flag C will be displayed on the signal boat with repetitive sound signals, and will remain displayed until the starting signal.

11. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE AFTER THE START

A change of the next leg of the course after the start will be signaled before the leading boat has begun the leg, although the new mark may not yet be in position.

12. THE FINISH

The finish line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on a race committee boat and the course side of the nearby finishing mark. For Courses "3", "5" and "7," the finish line will be located approximately 100 yards to windward of the windward mark. For Courses "4", "6", and "T", the finish line will be located approximately 100 yards to leeward of the leeward mark or gate and will be placed on the side at the RC signal boat opposite that of the starting mark.

13. PENALTY SYSTEM

13.1 For the Melges 24, S2 7.9, and A Cat classes, ONLY, US Sailing Prescription V1 (PENALTY AT THE TIME OF AN INCIDENT) will apply.

13.2 RRS Appendix T (ARBITRATION) will apply.

14. TIME LIMIT

- **14.1** The time limit for the first boat to sail a windward/ leeward course in accordance with RRS 28.1 is 2 1/2 hours.
- **14.2** Boats still racing 30 minutes after the first boat in that class finishes will be scored TLE (Time Limit Expired, see Scoring). This changes RRS 35.

15. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- **15.1** Protests and requests for redress, shall be written on US SAILING protest forms (available at the protest desk in the Regatta Room) and delivered there within one hour of the docking of the race committee finish boat for the division involved.
- **15.2** The times of hearings and the parties involved will be posted on the Official Notice Board. This posting constitutes the notice required by RRS 61.1(b) and 63.2 (Time and Place of the Hearing).

16. SCORING

16.1 One race will constitute a series. **16.2** A boat's series score will be the total of her race scores without discard.

16.3 Boats to be scored TLE and not thereafter retiring, being penalized, or given redress will be scored points equal to the number of boats finishing within the time limit plus two points by the race committee without a hearing. This changes RRS A4.1, A4.2 and A5.

16.4 Boats retiring from a race are requested to inform the race committee before leaving the racing area. [DP]

17. RADIO COMMUNICATION

17.1 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones. [DP]

17.2 A designated observer may

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report visual signals displayed by the race committee over VHF channel 68 for Division A, VHF channel 69 for Division B, VHF channel 72 for Division C, and VHF channel 05 for Division D. Errors or omissions on the part of the designated observer will not be grounds for granting redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

19. PARKING

Competitors' vehicles (other than those belonging to SPYC members) shall not be parked in the St. Petersburg Yacht Club parking garage. Competitors' vehicles shall not be parked at the St. Petersburg Sailing Center or elsewhere on Demens Landing from Thursday, February 17, 2022, through Sunday, February 20, 2022. The penalty for breaking this rule will be the disqualification of the boat with which the competitor is associated from all races on the

racing day closest to the breach. A boat may not protest under this rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a). Parking is available for a fee at the Al Lang Field parking lot, on the mainland just West of the Sailing Center. The hourly restrictions on street parking are strictly enforced.

20. PRIZES

20.1 Prizes will be awarded, after racing on Sunday, to the top three finishers of each qualifying class.
20.2 Each class winner is eligible for the 2022 Sailing World Regatta Series Caribbean Championship. The designated Challenger will be drawn at the conclusion of the event.
20.3 Additional prizes may be awarded

20.3 Additional prizes may be awarded to the top Junior Team (under 21 years of age), and top Mixed Plus Team (50% + female) to the J/70 Class or any one-design class with a minimum of 12 boats registered.

21. PHOTOGRAPHERS AND TV RIGHTS

Competitors give absolute right and permission to the OA for any photographs or video footage taken of themselves or their competing boat to be published in any media whatsoever; for either editorial or advertising purposes, or to be used in press information.

22. ENVIRONMENTAL

The Sailing World Regatta Series is working with Sailors for the Sea Powered by Oceana to become a certified Clean Regatta. Since 2006, Sailors for the Sea has worked with over 2,900 events and 750,000 sailors around the world to protect our playground. Please bring your reusable water bottles, consider car-pooling, and provision your boat with limited single-use plastics. Visit www. sailorsforthesea.org to learn more.



COURSE INSTRUCTIONS

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COURSE 3

"3" (three legs): Windward, leeward, finish to windward. Mark 2 may be passed on either side on the first upwind leg and mark 1 may be passed on either side on the finishing leg.

COURSE 4

"4" (four legs): Windward, leeward, windward, finish to leeward. Mark 2 may be passed on either side on the first windward leg and the finishing leg.

COURSE 5


"5" (five legs): Windward, leeward, windward, leeward, finish to windward. Mark 2 may be passed on either side on the first windward leg and mark 1 may be passed on either side of the finishing leg.


COURSE 6

"6" (six legs): Windward, leeward, windward, leeward, windward, finish to leeward. Mark 2 may be passed on either side on the first windward leg and the finishing leg.

COURSE T

"T" (Triangle): Windward, reach to Mark "T", reach to Mark 2/gate, windward, leeward to the finish. Mark 2 may be passed on either side on the first windward leg And the finishing leg.

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LAUNCHING/HAULING - The majority of launching will take place on Thursday, February 17th and nearly all the boats haul out after racing on Sunday, February 20th. Anyone who is able to launch earlier in the week, or haul on Monday is strongly encouraged to do so to avoid long lines.

The Sailing Center has 2-ton and 3-ton cranes. Traffic between Bayshore Drive and the Sailing Center will be strictly controlled. Dockage will be split between the main SPYC Marina and the Sailing Center. Dock space is limited, so all boats must be prepared to raft. *Please note:* There is no vehicle parking at the Sailing Center for the duration of the event. Trailer parking info is listed below.

TRAILER PARKING – In an effort to keep regatta costs down for our visiting sailors, we have arranged for complementary trailer storage surrounding the event dates. The trailer lot is located at Derby Lane (10490 Gandy Blvd N, St. Petersburg, FL 33702). ALL TRAILERS PARKED AT DERBY LANE MUST BE REGISTERED & TAGGED PRIOR TO BEING PLACED IN THE DERBY LANE LOT.
