# **Notice of Race**

The Midwest Sport Boat regatta is an event designed to promote participation and fair racing within a central Midwest location for Sportboat sailboats and Displacement Racer/Cruiser sailboats.

#### 1. Rules

- 1.1. The series will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2. All boats and crew are required to abide by federal, state, local laws, guidelines, restrictions for the operation of a boat on Saylorville Reservoir.
- 1.3. RRS 90.3 (e) shall apply, except that "24 hours" is replaced with "72 hours".

## 2. Sailing Instructions

2.1. The Sailing Instructions will be available prior to June 1, 2022, on the relevant Yachtscoring.com event page (<a href="https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eid=15084">https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eid=15084</a>).

#### 3. Communication

- 3.1. The online official notice board will be located at relevant Yachtscoring.com event page.
- 3.2. All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on Channels 16, 22, 68 and 72.
- 3.3. [DP] From the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communications that is not available to all boats.

# 4. Eligibility and Entry

- 4.1. Classes eligible for this event are defined as monohull or multihull sailboats with a minimum length of 18'. Boats that do not meet the length requirement may contact the Race Chair to be considered.
- 4.2. Any boat within the guidelines as listed in 4.1 is eligible to enter either class listed in registration entries 5.1.
- 4.3. Classes will be allocated to divisions based on boat type and assigned rating into an Open Sportboat Division and a Racer/Cruiser division.
- 4.4. Before participating in this event, every owner, competitor, and support person shall sign a Waiver of Liability on relevant Yachtscoring.com event page.
- 4.5. Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form found on the relevant Yachtscoring.com event page and paying their registration fees.

# 5. Registration and Entry Fees

5.1. Entry fees are as follows:

Class	Early Entry Fee	Standard Fee
Open Sportboat Class	\$125 by May 1	\$150 after May 1
Racer/Cruiser Class	\$125 by May 1	\$150 after May 1

- (a) NO entries will be accepted after June 5, 2022. Registration and payment shall be made online at: <a href="https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eid=15084">https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eid=15084</a>
- (b) Cancellation Refund Policy: No Refunds will be made after June 1, 2022. Refund requests made prior to June 1, 2022, will be half the entry fee.

#### 6. Schedule for Races

6.1. Dates of racing:

Date	Day of Week	Time of Warning
June 11, 2022	Saturday	1055 hrs
June 12, 2022	Sunday	1030 hrs

- 6.2. A Competitors meeting will be held at the grassy area north of the main marina parking lot on June 11, 2022, at 0900 hrs.
- 6.3. Number of Races
  - 6.3.1. A total of 8 races are scheduled for the Open Sportboat Class.
  - 6.3.2. A total of 2 distance races are scheduled for the Racer/Cruiser Class.
- 6.4. On the last day scheduled day of racing no warning will be made after 1400 hrs.

# 7. Venue

7.1. The location for racing will be the navigable water on Saylorville Lake between the dam and bridge.

#### 8. Courses

- 8.1. Courses for the Open Sportboat Class will be windward/leeward courses. Course diagrams will be provided in the Sailing Instructions.
- 8.2. Courses for Racer/Cruiser boats will be a single distance race each day utilizing the length of the lake and drop marks.

# 9. Penalty System

9.1. RRS Appendix V shall apply.

## 10. Scoring

- 10.1. A boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores.
- 10.2. Each boat shall be assigned a rating that is based on the PHRF rating system. Ratings will be based on the Midwest PHRF (MWPHRF) rating database. Participants can present a valid MWPHRF certificate, but a certificate is not required. If a boat does not have a MWPHRF rating the OA will assign a rating, based on information available on the US Sailing PHRF web page.
  - 10.2.1. Corrected times will be calculated using Time-on-Time correction, using the correction factor appropriate for average conditions.
  - 10.2.2. Any One Design (OD) class of 4 or more boats sailing under their respective OD class rules may be given their own Start.
  - 10.2.3. One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

#### 11. Risk Statement

- 11.1. RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury by or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia, or other causes.
- 11.2. Competitors participate in this event entirely at their own risk. See rule 3, Decision to Race. The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the events.

#### 12. Insurance

12.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$300,000 per incident or the equivalent.

# 13. Prizes

- 13.1. Each division shall receive trophies for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place.
- 13.2. A perpetual travelling trophy will be awarded to the boat with the best overall corrected time within the Open Sportboat Class.
- 13.3. A perpetual travelling trophy will be awarded to the boat with the best overall corrected time within the Racer/Cruiser class.
