- 1.2. U.S. Sailing prescriptions will apply, except for the prescriptions to RRS 63.2.
- 1.3. [NP] COVID-19 can be a serious health concern and each competitor shall judge his or her own ability to participate during this health threat. All applicable governmental regulations regarding health, safety and infectious disease control shall be strictly followed by all competitors, specifically including any crew limits and requirements for personal protective equipment (PPE).

### 2. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1. Amendments to these Sailing Instructions will be published on each race's website, accessible at <a href="www.chicagosailracing.org">www.chicagosailracing.org</a>, no later than 24 hours before a race's start time. Skippers of entered yachts will be sent via email or text (or both) regarding amendments, and the Race Committee may broadcast information regarding these amendments via VHF 78. Failure to receive these communications shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1.

### 3. COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

3.1. Notices to Competitors will be published on each race's website, accessible via <a href="www.chicagosailracing.org">www.chicagosailracing.org</a>, and a courtesy notification may be sent via e-mail and/or text to all entered competitors. Additionally, the Race Committee may provide courtesy broadcasts during each race via VHF 78. These broadcasts are intended to assist all boats in understanding how the race is being conducted. Such broadcasts are not grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1.

### 4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1. Signals made ashore shall be displayed at the Organizing Authority's clubhouse.
- 4.2. When flag AP is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 75 minutes" in the race signal AP.
- 4.3. Information provided via code flags may also be sent as a courtesy via email and text message to skippers of all entered yachts. Failure to receive courtesy emails, text messages, or broadcasts are not grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1.

### 5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

Schedule of Races will be as prescribed in Section 7 of the Notice of Race.

### 7. CHECK-IN/CHECK-OUT

When arriving at the starting area, boats shall approach the Race Committee boat, hail their sail number, and receive acknowledgement from the Race Committee. If a boat withdraws from the race, it shall notify the Race Committee via VHF 78.

### 8. COURSES

- 8.1. The diagrams in Addendum A show the courses, the order in which boats shall pass marks, and the side on which boats shall pass them.
- 8.2. Courses in Addendum A are windward/leeward courses.
- 8.3. No later than the warning signal, the Race Committee signal boat will display the course, the approximate compass bearing, the distance of the first leg, the number of legs to be sailed, and the course assignment for each class.
- 8.4. Course information may be repeated by courtesy broadcasts on VHF 78. Errors or omissions in courtesy broadcasts are not grounds for a request for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a)

- 8.5. For windward/leeward courses, Mark 1 may have an offset. In the event that the offset is not in place, the single windward Mark 1 shall be left to port. Mark 2 may be a gate. In the event that the gate is not in place, the single leeward Mark 2 shall be left to port.
- 8.6. In some cases, Organizing Authorities may choose to conduct races with alternative courses, such as trapezoid and triangle courses. Such courses, if used, will be described in Amendments to these Sailing Instructions.

### 9. MARKS

- 9.1. For windward/leeward courses, the starting mark will be a yellow inflatable mark, and marks 1 and 2 will be orange inflatable marks.
- 9.2. For windward/leeward courses, the finishing mark for upwind finishes will be the active long course weather mark. The finishing mark for downwind finishes will be white.
- 9.3. When the "Bravo Course" is signaled by the race committee, the race shall be as shown in Addendum A. The starting (pin), leeward and finish marks shall be a single orange mark left to port for the start and leeward mark, and left to starboard at the finish.
- 9.4. For the following CCYC hosted races, it is the intent to use robotic drone Race Marks (AKA MarkSetBots):
  - 9.4.1. Spring Opener (MAY 28 & 29,2022)
  - 9.4.2. Holbeman Regatta (September 11, 2022)
  - 9.4.3. Herb Kaczmarek Regatta (October 1, 2022)

- 9.4.4. Routine movement of MarkSetBots will not be grounds for redress. This includes minor readjustments, marks returning to station after having been pushed away by a competitor, and collisions with marks that are not actively marks of the course presuming these collisions do not cause damage. This changes RRS 60.1(b), and RRS 62.1.
- 9.4.5. Mark 1 shall be a MarkSetBot and shall be left to port.
- 9.4.6. Mark 2 shall be a gate and will be made up of 2 MarkSetBots.
- 9.4.7. In the event that the gate is not in place, a single Mark 2 shall be left to Port. It may be a MarkSetBot or a tetrahedron.
- 9.4.8. The pin end of the start line shall consist of a tetrahedron.
- 9.4.9. All finishes shall be downwind, unless the RC shortens the course.
- 9.4.10. The finish mark shall consist of a white tetrahedron placed to starboard of the race committee boat.
- 9.4.11. The Race Committee may replace any mark with either a tetrahedron or a MarkSetBot.

### 10. OBSTRUCTIONS

The area around the pumping stations (cribs) and the marks placed around them by the Coast Guard are hereby designated as an obstruction. Boats shall treat them as such, and not sail between the marks.

### 11. THE START

- 11.1. The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the signal boat at the starboard end and the course side of the port-end starting mark.
- 11.2. The Race Committee may set a guard mark off the stern of the signal boat. In such a case, boats shall not sail between the signal boat and the guard mark.
- 11.3. For each class's start, the Race Committee will fly the appropriate class flag, as set forth in the below table. Boats racing in LMPHRF class shall fly the appropriate class flag on their backstay.

- 11.4. A boat starting later than four minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A4 and RRS A5.
- 11.5. If a boat breaks RRS 29.1 at her starting signal and she is identified, the Race Committee will attempt to broadcast her sail number on the designated hailing channel. Errors or omissions in courtesy broadcasts or hails are not grounds for a request for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

11.6. The Race Committee may combine classes for a start, and may abandon a class start if there are no boats at the starting area to fill that class.

### 12. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

12.1. A course change of five degrees or less will not be signaled by the Race Committee. The course change will continue to use the active mark. This changes RRS 33(a).

### 13. THE FINISH

13.1. The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on a Race Committee boat and the course side of the finishing mark.

### 14. PENALTY SYSTEM

Appendix V1 will apply.

### 15. TIME LIMITS

- 15.1. The Race Time Limit for each race will be 120 minutes.
- 15.2. One-design class boats failing to finish within 20 minutes after the first boat in their class sails the course within the time limit and finishes will be scored Time Limit Expired (TLE). This changes RRS 35, RRS A4, RRS A5 and RRS A10.

### 16. HEARING REQUESTS

- 16.1. Protests and requests for redress shall be filed with the Race Committee by 1200 hours on the first weekday following the weekend's races. Protests shall be filed via the portal on each event's registration website.
- 16.2. Protest and redress hearings will be scheduled by each Organizing Authority's Protest Committee.

### 17. SCORING

- 17.1. Each race addressed herein will be scored individually.
- 17.2. Class breaks will be set by each Organizing Authority and be transmitted to competitors via e-mail or text by 1200 hours on Thursday prior to each weekend's race(s).
- 17.3. A boat's total score will be the sum of her scores for all Races. No score will be discarded. One completed race will constitute a regatta. This changes RRS A2.
- 17.4. Time-on-Time scoring will be applied using the following formula: HCP Rating = 650/(550 + MWPHRF HCP Rating).
- 17.5. Boats racing in a One-Design class shall be scored without a handicap certificate and be scored by order of its finish. Each boat will be scored by its elapsed time within its class, the lowest elapsed time wins.
- 17.6. A boat scored Time Limit Expired (TLE) will receive points equal to the last place boat that finished within the time limit plus one point, without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, RRS A4, RRS A5, and RRS A10.

Prizes will be awarded as described in the Notice of Race. Each Organizing Authority will provide information about prize-giving ceremonies via e-mail and/or text to all competitors.


## ADDENDUM A Windward/Leeward Course Diagram








Boats racing in the Chicago to Michigan City and return, the Chicago to St. Joseph Race, St. Joseph to Chicago Race, St. Joseph to Michigan City and Michigan City to Chicago Race shall hail the race committee on VHF 78 when approximately 1 nautical mile from the finish, then provide sail number & boat name.
- 11.5. For the following races, yachts shall e-mail or text a Yacht Finish Report to the addressees indicated within three hours of finishing:

Waukegan to Chicago:
Chicago to Michigan City and Return
Third Coast Cup
Pursuit of Happiness
Chicago to St. Joseph
Bi-State Fly-By
St. Joseph to Chicago
St. Joseph to Michigan City

- 11.6. Yacht finish reports shall include: 1) boat name; 2) sail number; 3) owner name; 4) finish time (timed or approximate); 4) finish time of yacht ahead (timed or approximate); and 5) finish time of yacht astern (timed or approximate). For e-mailed yacht finish reports, the subject line of the e-mail shall contain only the sail number of the yacht reporting her finish.
- 11.7. If the Race Committee boat is absent from the designated finish line, an alternate finish line may be described in each race's amendment to these Sailing Instructions, and boats should cross the alternate finish line. Upon doing so, the boat shall report its finish time (per its GPS) to the Race Committee via VHF 78.

### 12. PENALTY SYSTEM

12.1. RRS 44.3 shall apply, modified as follows: "The corrected finish of a boat that accepts a penalty under RRS 44.3 shall be 20% of the number of boats started in that class, taken to the higher whole number, but such penalty shall place a yacht no worse than last in her class. Her adjusted place, for determining her placement in her division, shall be one second greater than the time of the boat placing just before her in her division. This changes RRS A.4.1 and A5.

12.2. A boat successfully protested by the Race Committee for failing to properly display her class or sail number board as required, shall be penalized one place in her class. Her corrected time shall be the next boat to finish in her class, plus one second. This changes RRS A4.1 and A5.

#### 13. **TIME LIMITS**

The time limit for each race will be 1700 hours, excepting the following Races, which shall have time limits as stated below:

Chicago to Waukegan: 1800 hours Waukegan to Chicago: 1800 hours

Chicago to Michigan City and Return: 1400 hours (June 26)

Rainbow Reaatta 2330 hours Third Coast Cup: 1900 hours

1300 hours (September 5)

Chicago to St. Joseph: Bi-State Flv-Bv

Bi-State -- St. Joseph to Chicago: 0100 hours (September 7) Tri-State -- St. Joseph to Michigan City: 2000 hours

Tri-State -- Michigan City to Chicago: 2000 hours

#### 14. **HEARING REQUESTS**

- A boat intending to protest or seek redress shall notify the Race Committee of the sail number(s) of the boat(s) being protested immediately after finishing and shall receive specific acknowledgement.
- 14.2. Protests and requests for redress shall be filed with the Race Committee by 1200 hours on the first weekday following the weekend's races. Protests shall be submitted via the appropriate portal on each Race's website.
- 14.3. Protest and redress hearings will be scheduled by each Organizing Authority's Protest Committee.
- 14.4. Violations of Section 4 of the Notice of Races are protestable only by the Race Committee.

#### 15. **SCORING**

- 15.1. Each race addressed herein will be scored individually.
- 15.2. Class breaks will be set by each Organizing Authority, and shall be posted on the Official Notice board no later than 2000 hours on the day prior to the event's start time, with courtesy notifications sent to all competitors via email or text. Failure to receive courtesy emails, text messages, or broadcasts are not grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1.
- 15.3. Time-on-Time scoring will be applied using The following formula: HCP rating = 650 / (550 + MWPHRF DHCP Rating).
