

BAYVIEW YACHT CLUB'S 4th ANNUAL WOMEN'S INVITATIONAL REGATTA

For the Natalie O'Neil Cup AUGUST 18-19, 2007

Notice of Race (as amended 7/7/07)

Organizing Authority: Bayview Yacht Club

1. RULES

- 1.1 The Regatta will be governed by the rules as defined by the 2005-2008 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) including the US SAILING prescriptions.
- 1.2 Individual Class Rules will apply subject to the following **modifications**; 1.) Skippers are not required to be a member of the class 2.) VHF radios are permitted.

2. ADVERTISING

- 2.1 This regatta is designated Category A in accordance with ISAF Advertising Code, Regulation 20; except that the Organizing Authority may allow additional advertising to the extent provided under Regulation 20.3 and 20.3.2.
- 2.2 Boats shall not be permitted to protest for an alleged breach of any rule regarding advertising. This changes RRS 60.1.

3. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 3.1 The Regatta is open to any boat that either: a) is an active member of the recognized class association for entry in this regatta's One Design classes or; b) is a boat which has a PHRF rating as assigned by the DRYA.
- 3.2 One Design Classes are tentatively set to include:
 - C&C 35 Cal25 Crescent Melges 24 Tartan Ten U20
- 3.3 Four or more registered boats in any of the One Design classes depicted above will be granted their own scoring start.
- 3.4 All skippers and crew members must be female.

3.5 Completed entry forms, with the entry fee, shall be mailed to Bayview Yacht Club, Attn: Women's Invitational Regatta Registration, 100 Clairepointe, Detroit, MI 48215, or completed online at <u>www.byc.com</u> (Click on Events).
Deadline for entry is August 10, 2007. Late entries may be accepted solely at the discretion of the Organizing Authority with a Late Registration Fee of \$15.00.

4. COURSES

4.1 Courses for Saturday and Sunday will be sailed at the lower end of Lake St. Clair and in the Detroit River. Two separate courses may be set or a long and short course set in the same venue. All competitors will monitor VHF Channel 72 the mornings of the regatta for verbal instructions.

It is the intention of the Race Committee to conduct as many races as the weather permits, except that there will be no Warning Signal after 1500 on Sunday.

6. **REGISTRATION/WEIGH-IN**

- 6.1. Registration check-in and Sailing Instructions, Saturday, August 18th and Sunday, August 19th (0800 – 0900). It is the intent of the Organizing Authority to also have the Sailing Instructions available online at www.byc.com and in the Bayview Yacht Club bar on Friday, August 17th.
- 6.2. Neither the Organizing Authority nor the Bayview Yacht Club shall be responsible for conducting or administering weigh-ins should they be required by individual class rules. Local or national class associations shall be responsible for conducting weigh-ins if needed.

7. SCORING

The Low-Point Scoring System, RRS Appendix A4 will apply, except that each boat's total score will be the sum of all races. One completed race will constitute a Regatta.

8. COURTESY BROADCASTS

BYC Women's Invitational Regatta Notice of Race

The Race Committee may provide general information to competitors on VHF Channel 72. Information so provided will not be subject to action under RRS 62.

9. PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded to each yacht placing 1st, 2nd or 3rd for the Regatta. The first place winners in each class will have their names inscribed on the **Natalie O'Neil Cup** trophy.
