NOTICE OF RACE

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 International Melges 24 Class Association Class Rules shall apply. These may be changed by the sailing instructions.
- 1.3 As per RRS 79, World Sailing Regulations Appendix 4, Regulation 22 World Sailing Sailor Categorization Code will apply.
- 1.4 MYC follows current Local, State, and CDC COVID requirements. As those requirements continually change, race competitors will be required to follow race day requirements set forth by MYC.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 The sailing instructions will be available online at Yachscoring.com and at Registration on Friday, May 19.

- 3 COMMUNICATION
- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at www.Yachtscoring.com
- 3.2 All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on Channel 73
- 3.3 The Race Committee will communicate with the competitors using VHF channel 73. The information is provided as a courtesy. Any errors or omissions of these broadcasts or failure to hear them shall not constitute grounds for granting redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 3.4 [DP] [While racing][From the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day], except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.
- 4 ELIGIBILITY, ENTRY, AND FEES
- 4.1 The regatta is open to all Melges 24 One-Design vessels.
- 4.2 The required fee for the regatta is \$250.00, payable via Yachtscoring.com by midnight Wednesday, May 17. Entries made from May 18 to 0930 May 20 will be \$275.00. The entry fee includes 4 dinners on Saturday Night. Additional dinners will be available during registration. Friday Brats & Keg, Four Saturday dinner tickets, and Saturday and Sunday continental breakfast are included. Limited free dockage also available. Make checks payable to Muskegon Yacht Club.
- 4.3 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.
- 5 ADVERTISING
- 5.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

- 6.3 On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 1300 hrs.
- 7 VENUE
- 7.1 Courses will be sailed on the waters of Muskegon Lake
- 7.2 Muskegon Yacht Club is located at 3198 Edgewater Street on the Southwest side of Muskegon Lake. The MYC phone number is 231-755-1414.
- 8 COURSES
- 8.1 Courses will be on windward/leeward as specified by the Sailing Instructions. Course length will be based on sailing conditions.
- 9 PENALTY SYSTEM
- 9.1 Rule RRS 44.2 will apply.
- 10 SCORING
- 10.1 The Low Point scoring system, RRS Appendix A4, will apply, modified so that each boat's series score will be the total of all of her race scores. Six (6) or more races are scheduled.
- 10.2 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 11 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS
- 11.1 [DP] There are no restrictions for hauling out after racing on any day.

12 RISK STATEMENT

12.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

13 INSURANCE

13.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$300,000 (USD) per incident or the equivalent.

14 PRIZES

14.1 Awards and prizes will be handed out in a timely manner at the conclusion of racing on Sunday, May 21.
