10.2 The race committee may, without signal, move a mark to change the direction up to 10 degrees or the length up to 10% of the previous length, provided that no boat is sailing to the mark.

- **10.3** In the event of the next leg change of the course, Mark 1a will not be relocated. Boats shall round the new Mark 1, leaving it to port.


