### 2023 SANDUSKY ISLANDS RACE AUGUST 26, 2023

# Hosted by Sandusky Sailing Club SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

#### 1. RULES

The race will be governed by the 2021-2024 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), applicable One Design Rules, PHRF Lake Erie Rules and these Sailing Instructions.

#### 2. ENTRIES

The race is open to members of US SAILING, members of other National Authorities, members of recognized yacht clubs, members of recognized sailing class associations, and others as may be determined by the Organizing Authority. Registration is to be completed as instructed in the Notice of Race.

#### 3. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 3.1. Prior to the race, notices to competitors and changes to these Sailing Instructions will be posted on the Official notice board located on the front porch of the SSC Clubhouse and at www.yachtscoring.com no later than 0730 hours on August 26, 2023
- 3.2. After the race, notices to competitors will posted on the Official notice board located on the front porch of the SSC Clubhouse and at www.yachtscoring.com.

#### 4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1. Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flagpole located northeast of the SSC Clubhouse.
- 4.2. When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes' in the race signal AP.

#### 5. OFFICIAL TIME AND RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 5.1. Official time shall be EDT as referenced by GPS.
- 5.2. SSC Race Committee boats will monitor VHF Channel 72.
- 5.3. Radio communications shall not be initiated with the race committee during the starting sequence except for emergencies.
- 5.4. No boat shall make radio transmissions nor receive communications not available to all boats while racing, unless directed to by these Sailing Instructions or the Race Committee. This prohibition includes mobile telephones and mobile web services.

#### 6. SCHEDULE and CLASS FLAGS

- 6.1. A one hour horn will be sounded at 0900 hours. The first warning signal will be at 0955 hours.
- 6.2. The description of the class flags and the starting order of the classes will be posted on the Official Notice Board and at www.yachtscoring.com no later than 2200 hours on Friday, Aug 25, 2023.

#### 7. COURSES

- 7.1 The courses are described and illustrated in Appendix A of the Sailing Instructions.
- 7.2 Prior to the warning signal for a class, the Race Committee shall display a placard showing the letter of the course to be sailed by that class.
- 7.3 Courses can be shortened in accordance with RRS 32.2a. In addition to the provisions of RRS 32, the Race Committee will announce its intention to shorten course via VHF Ch. 72.
- 7.4 Due to weather conditions the Race Committee may, at its discretion, display Code Flag "S" at the start. If this action is taken, all classes shall sail COURSE C as described in Appendix A.

#### 8. THE START

- 8.1 The starting area will be approximately 0.5 NM east of the Sandusky Harbor Breakwater light.
- 8.2 The starting line will be between the staff on the signal boat displaying an orange flag at the starboard end and the orange inflatable "pumpkin" at the port end.
- 8.3 The starting line will be perpendicular to the course to the first mark regardless of the wind direction.
- 8.4 The Race Committee will attempt to hail, via VHF Ch. 72, the sail numbers of boats that are OCS.
- 8.5 The absence of a hail or the inability to hear a hail identifying a boat or boats that are OCS, shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1.
- 8.6 Cruising Class boats shall start within 5 minutes of their starting signal. Their actual starting times shall be recorded by the Race Committee

#### 9. THE FINISH

- 9.1. The finish line will be between the staff flying a BLUE flag on the signal boat and the Bay Point Shoal Lighted Buoy 2 FI R 4s.
- 9.2. All boats sailing the race shall hail the Race Committee on VHF Ch. 72 when they come abeam of Marblehead Light FI G 6s.

#### 10. CHECK IN

All boats intending to race shall check in verbally with the Race Committee on the signal boat while Code Flag "L" is displayed. They shall supply their sail number and class to be sailed and be acknowledged by the Race Committee.

#### 11. RETIRING

All boats retiring from the race shall notify the Race Committee as soon as possible via VHF Ch. 72 or by phone to 419-366-8996.

#### 12. PROTESTS

- 12.1. A boat intending to protest shall notify the Race Committee on the finish boat of her intent within 10 minutes of her finish. This changes RRS 61.
- 12.2. Protest forms will be available in the Commodore's Room at SSC.
- 12.3. Completed protest forms shall be delivered to the PRO within 1 hour of the time of the committee boat docking time.

#### 13. SCORING

Handicap scoring shall be "Time on Distance"
