Notice of Race (NoR)

Initial release posted: August 6, 2023

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 National prescriptions of Sail Canada <u>RRS 2021-2024 Sail Canada Prescriptions</u> will apply.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be available at <u>Yacht Scoring</u> no later than the start of registration.

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The official notice board is located at <u>Yacht Scoring</u>.
- 3.2 [NP] [DP] All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on 69, 71, 72 and 73.
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee may make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the SI supplement.
- 3.4 [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The event is open to all boats of the Shark 24 class where either:
 - (a) the person in charge is a full member of the Canadian Shark Class Association (CSCA), or
 - (b) if this is the first CSCA-sanctioned event that the crew is entering in 2023, all crewmembers shall be associate members of CSCA.
- 4.2 Boats may enter the event by registering online at <u>Yacht Scoring</u>.
- 4.3 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall:
 - (a) complete the registration form,
 - (b) register all crewmembers, and
 - (c) pay all fees.

5 FEES

5.1 The entry fees which include 3 dinner tickets are as follows:

- (a) the early entry fee until September 14 is \$175,
- (b) the standard entry fee is 195,
- (c) if every crewmember is under the age of 25 years, CSCA will pay the entry fee provided they have not claimed this incentive at any other regatta in this calendar year. Please notify the Regatta Chair Jacob Harper <u>jacob.da.harper@gmail.com</u> prior to September 17 to apply for this exemption.

5.2 Other Fees:

(a) Additional dinner tickets are \$30 each.



- 6.5 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first day of racing is 1100.
- 6.6 The scheduled time of the warning signal for subsequent days of racing is 1000.
- 6.7 On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 1500.

7 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- 7.1 Each boat shall produce or verify the existence of a valid measurement certificate. However, a boat may race without a valid measurement certificate provided:
 - (a) it complies with all other class rules,
 - (b) it has not competed in another CSCA-sanctioned counter regatta in this calendar year,
 - (c) it has not been issued a valid measurement certificate within the past five years, and
 - (d) the person in charge has signed a "statement of understanding" available on the Documents & Forms page at: <u>Yacht Scoring</u>

This changes RRS 78.1.

7.2 Boats may be inspected at any time.

8 VENUE

8.1 NoR Addendum A shows the location of the racing areas.

9 COURSES

9.1 The course diagrams (L, LA, W and WA) in RRS S show the courses, including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

10 SCORING

- 10.1 2 races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 10.2 Series Score:
 - (a) When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - (b) When 5 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 10.3 RRS A5.3 applies.

11 CHARTERED OR LOANED BOATS

11.1 A chartered or loaned boat may carry national letters or a sail number in contravention of her class rules, provided that the race committee has approved her sail identification before the first race.

12 BERTHING

12.1 [DP] Boats shall be kept in their assigned places while in the harbour.

13 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

13.1 [DP] Boats shall not be hauled out during the event except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the race committee.

14 DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

- 14.1 Underwater breathing apparatus and plastic pools or their equivalent shall not be used around keelboats between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the event.
- 14.2 [DP] Boats shall not be cleaned below the waterline by any means during the event.

15 RISK STATEMENT

15.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. **Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.**

16 INSURANCE

16.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$2 million per incident or the equivalent.


17 PRIZES

- 17.1 Prizes will be given as follows:
 - (a) the Homecomers Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the regatta, and
 - (b) keeper prizes will be awarded to the captains and crew of the first five boats.

ARRIVAL AND RIGGING

Trailers may be dropped, and boats may be rigged, on the club property in locations which won't interfere with activities of NOLSC members or staff.

LAUNCHING AND MOORING

Launch and haul-out is at the Shark hoist inside the club. Please follow crane use instructions at the hoist (please pull on the ropes – not the wires or the control pendant box) – there will be someone there to help you. Boats shall use the assigned dock given to them at launch, for the duration of the event, unless written permission to change has been granted by the regatta chair or his authorized representative. Some rafting may be required. Trailers shall be stored as directed at launch.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Competitors and their immediate families are invited to use the club facilities during the regatta. There is space available for camping and trailers. Please let the club know in advance if you will be bringing a trailer or recreational vehicle by emailing the office directly via email at nolsc@niagarasailing.on.ca
