NOTICE OF RACE (NoR) inc. Amendment No. 1

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1 RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 For ORC classes, the "Nearshore" category of the US Sailing Safety Equipment Requirements (available at https://www.ussailing.org/competition/offshore/safety-information
- 1.3 ORC Open and ORC Performance Cruiser class rules are modified by ORC of the Chesapeake and can be found at http://www.orcches.org
- 1.4 J/105 Class Rules are modified by Article IX of the local J-105 Fleet-3 Article/Rules. This event is designated a Level 1A event. J/105 Fleet-3 Articles/Rules can be found at https://www.j105fleet3.org/rules

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 The sailing instructions will be posted on the Official Notice Board approximately 10 days before the first scheduled day of racing.

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eid=16353
- 3.2 [DP] All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on US channels.
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee may make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The specific channel will be stated in the SIs.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 Boats in the Alberg 30, Cal 25, Harbor 20, J/22, J/30, J/70, J/80, J/105, ORC Open and ORC Performance Cruiser and Viper 640 classes are invited to participate.
- 4.2 For a class to have a start, it must have a minimum of 5 paid entries by 1200 on Friday, July 26. Entry fees for boats in classes that fail to meet the minimum will be returned.
- 4.3 Boats wishing to enter shall register online at https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eid=16353
- 4.4 Boats in an ORC class shall have a current valid ORC certificate. For more information, visit http://www.ussailing.org The OA will post assignments of boats in the ORC fleet to starting classes no later than 1700 on Wednesday, July 24. The OA may change the assignment of an ORC boat's starting class until 1700 on Friday, July 26.
- 4.5 To be considered a valid entry in the event, a boat shall complete all entry requirements including the waiver and pay all fees.

5 FEES

- Early entry fee of \$70 is due by 1700 on Monday, July 15. After that, an entry fee of \$95 will be accepted until 1200 on Friday, July 26. Entry fees are payable in full upon registering and are nonrefundable.
- 5.2 The entry fee includes, at a minimum, racing and awards.

6 SCHEDULE

6.1 Racing days, course location and classes are as follows:

Racing Day	Bay Course	River Course
Saturday	ORC Open, ORC Performance Cruising, J/105	
Sunday	Alberg 30, J/22, Cal 25, J/30, J/70, J80, Viper 640	Harbor 20

- 6.2 The warning signal for the first race of the regatta is scheduled for 1000 for ORC Performance Cruising Classes on Saturday. The warning signal for all other classes will be at 1100 on both Saturday and Sunday.
- 6.3 No warning signal will be made after 1530.

7 VENUE

7.1 The racing area for the River Course will be the Severn River east of the USNA. The racing area for the Bay Course will be the Chesapeake Bay off the mouth of the Severn River.

8 COURSES

8.1 Two drop marks races are scheduled for the ORC Open and up to four drop mark races are scheduled for the J/105 Class on Saturday. ORC Performance Cruiser classes will sail one Government Mark race on Saturday. Three drop marks races are scheduled for all Classes sailing on Sunday.

9 PENALTY SYSTEM

9.1 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

10 SCORING

- 10.1 RRS Appendix A4, Low Point System, will apply as changed by the SIs.
- 10.2 Corrected times for ORC classes will be calculated using ORC Time-on-Time ratings. The race committee will assign the appropriate course type and wind strength for handicapping prior to scoring as detailed in the SIs.
- 10.3 Boats not completing all entry requirements by 1200 on Friday, July 26 will not be scored.

11 RISK STATEMENT

11.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue *racing* is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks, which are assumed by the competitor.

12 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$300,000 combined single limit. Competitors are solely responsible for obtaining the required coverage.

13 PRIZES

- Prizes will be given in each class for 1st place with 3 or more starters (boats starting in at least one race), 2nd place with 6 or more starters, and 3rd place with 9 or more starters.
- 13.2 The OA anticipates that the following perpetual trophies will be awarded (as further described in the SIs):
 - (a) Magruder Trophy: first in the Harbor 20 class.
 - (b) Elizade Trophy: first in the J/105 class.
 - (c) Labrot Trophy: best overall performance in ORC.
 - (d) Severn Boat Club Trophy: first in ORC I.
 - (e) Fernandez Trophy: first in ORC 2.

- (e) William H. Kruse Memorial Trophy: first in ORC 3.
- (f) America's Trophy: this event will be part of the season AYC series for overall performance in ORC.
- (g) AYC J/105 Regatta Series Trophy: this event will be part of the season AYC series for overall Performance in the J/105 class.
- 13.3 Additional prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the organizing authority.
