

# Columbia Yacht Club Race Event: Emergency Card

## Emergency or Life-Threatening Injury - Steps

1. Render assistance to the injured person, (first-aid, CPR), ensure vessel safety and account for all crew and their safety.
2. Assign a crew member to handle communications and call for Help & Emergency Medical Attention. Call 9-1-1 first. If practical also place Mayday call to Chicago Marine Unit, VHF16. Information ultimately gets to the Chicago Marine Unit from 9-1-1 but can take several minutes.
  - A. 9-1-1 on your cellular telephone
  - B. Chicago Marine Unit: VHF #16, 9-1-1 (Non-emergency only +1-312-742-3203 like body found)
  - C. Coast Guard Calumet Station: VHF #16, +1-773-768-4093
  - D. Columbia Yacht Club: VHF #78, +1-312-938-3625
3. Contact Race Committee explain the situation, any need coordination, via VHF# Set up for the race.
4. Monitor injured person, administer first-aid
5. Transfer injured to care of Emergency Team at location specified by Chicago Marine Unit (or 911)
6. Complete an incident report with authorities

## Be prepared to tell 9-1-1 / Chicago Marine Unit:

- Current location of injured person(s) (Latitude / Longitude)
- Description of boat(s) (if requesting on-water help)
- Where you plan to bring injured person ashore (see map below, authorities may assign)
- Age/gender/number of injured people
- Type of injury/situation
- Your name and call back number

## Emergency Response Pick-Up Locations:

#	Name	Description	Lat/Long
1	Bus Turnaround - NW Corner of Navy Pier	North side of Navy Pier, all the way to shore. Between Navy Pier and water filtration plant	41 53.56' N, 087 36.53' W
2	Queen's Landing - Monroe Harbor	Monroe Harbor straight in from harbor entrance. Right in front of Buckingham Fountain.	41 52.54' N, 087 36.92' W
