SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

The event will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024.

- 1.1 The international Etchells Class Code of Conduct will apply details can be found via this link: https://etchells.org/news/article/ieca-code-of-conduct
- 1.2 Boats will be provided with bow number stickers by the UK Etchells class. They shall be placed 52cm aft of the bow,6cm from the shearline and 6cm apart. Single digit numbers (e.g.'2') shall display the leading zero (e.g.'02') These stickers shall be applied prior to the first race of the series. It is the responsibility of competitors to ensure that these are properly in place before racing each day.

2. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it takes effect. Any changeto the schedule of races will also be posted by 0900 on the day it takes effect.

3. COMMUNICATION WITH COMPETITORS

- 3.1. Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located at www.yachtscoring.com. Therace committee will use the event WhatsApp group to alert competitors when there has been a posting.
- 3.2. On the water, the race committee intends to monitor and communicate with competitors on VHF radio channel 77.
- 3.3. Competitors briefing will take place at the Pontoon View in Cowes Yacht Haven on Saturday 20th July at 0915.
- 3.4. The following communications may be made by the race committee on VHF radio: location of race committee vessel, alternate preparatory signals, courses, postponement, abandonment, starting signals, recalls.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

4.1. No signals will be displayed ashore. The race committee will use the ISC Etchells WhatsApp group to keep competitors informed whilst ashore.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

Three (3) races per day are scheduled, however a maximum of four (4) races per day may be sailed.

6. CLASS FLAG

The class flag for the Etchells Class will be code flag 'E'.

7. RACING AREA

The location of the start line will be announced via the event WhatsApp group by 0930 each race day.

8. COURSES

- 8.1. The diagrams in SI Appendix A show the course(s), including the approximate angles between legs, the orderin which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be rounded.
- 8.2. No later than the warning signal, the race committee signal vessel will display the course signal and theapproximate compass bearing of the first leg.
- 8.3. If either gate mark 2s or 2p is missing, boats shall round the remaining gate mark to port.

9. MARKS

- 9.1. Marks 1, 1a, 2s and 2p will be black Island Sailing Club inflatable buoys.
- 9.2. The start and finish marks will be an orange buoy.

10. THE START

- 10.1. To alert boats that a race will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be displayed with one sound at least5 minutes before a warning signal is made.
- 10.2. The starting line is defined as being between a staff displaying an orange flag on the committee vessel at the starboard end and either the course side of the port end starting mark, or a staff displaying an orange flag on a rib
- 10.3. In addition to RRS 29.1, if any part of a boat's hull is on the course side of the starting line at her starting signal and she is identified, the race committee will attempt to hail her bow or sail number on VHF radio. Failure to hail her number, failure of her to hear such a hail, or the order in which boats are hailed will not be grounds for a redress request. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 10.4. A boat that does not start within 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored DNS without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.

11. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

- 11.1. To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will lay a new mark (or move the finish line) andremove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.
- 11.2. The race committee may change a leg of the course by up to ten (10) degrees in bearing and/or 200m in lengthwithout a signal. This changes RRS 33.

12. THE FINISH

The finishing line is between a staff displaying a blue flag on the signal vessel at one end of the line and thecourse side of the nearby finishing mark.

13. PENALTY SYSTEM

13.1 A boat may take a One-Turn Penalty when she may have broken a rule of Part 2 or rule 31 while racing. However, when a boat may have broken a rule of Part 2 while in the zone around a mark other than a startingmark, her penalty shall be a Two-Turns Penalty. This changes RRS 44.1.

14. TIME LIMIT AND TARGET TIME

- 14.1. The time limit for each race will be 90 minutes.
- 14.2. The Target Time for each race will be 45 minutes. Failure to meet the Target Time will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

15. HEARING REQUESTS

- 15.1. The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat finishes the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later. The time will be posted on the online official notice board.
- 15.2. Protest forms are available from the race office at Cowes Yacht Haven or the Island Sailing Club.
- 15.3. Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the protest room, located at the Island Sailing Club at the time posted, but may not happen on the day of the protest.

16. SCORING

- 16.1 One (1) race is required to constitute a series.
- 16.2 When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 16.3 When five (5) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her racescores excluding her worst score.

17. SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 17.1. Before the first warning signal for the first race each day, each boat shall: 1) sail past the race committee vesselon starboard tack; 2) announce her bow number; and 3) obtain the recognition of her bow number by the racecommittee.
- 17.2. A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee via VHF before leaving the course, or, when that is impossible, immediately after arrival ashore by contacting the race committee via the event WhatsApp Group.

18. REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

The substitution of competitors is not allowed without prior written approval of the Organising Authority.

19. OFFICIAL VESSELS

- 19.1. The Race Committee signal vessel will be the M/V Cowes United, flying an Island Sailing Club burgee.
- 19.2. Race Committee support vessels will be RIBs flying Island Sailing Club burgees.


