SAILING INSTRUCTIONS / RACING DIVISION / CRUISING DIVISION

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS), the prescriptions of the United States Sailing Association (US Sailing), and applicable U.S. and Canadian governmental requirements.
- 1.2 The current PHRF-LE class rules shall apply to all yachts in the Racing Division. The Cruising Division will have their PHRF Handicaps assigned by the Organizing Authority.
- 1.3 RRS 63.7 shall be replaced by: "If there is a conflict between a rule in the Notice of Race and a rule in the Sailing Instructions, the Sailing Instructions shall apply."

2. COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice boards. Refer to respective race pages for specific notice board locations.
- 2.2 The race committee intends to use VHF channel 79 to broadcast courtesy information to competitors, including OCS hails and other race information. Failure to broadcast or failure of a boat to hear shall not be grounds for granting redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

3. CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 2200 on the day before it will take effect.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed in the vicinity of the host clubhouse/building.
- 4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced by 'not less than 1 hour' in the race signal AP.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

5.1 Dates of racing:

- 5.2 The Racing Division (R) will sail up to five races as defined in the individual course descriptions.
- 5.2 Depending on entries, the Cruising Division will be scored for two separate 3-day race series (C1) and (C2) as shown in SI 5.1. Cruising Division boats may sail any of the five races.
- 5.3 The scheduled time of the warning signal for each class is shown on the individual course descriptions.

6. CLASS FLAGS

6.1 Class flags will be as follows:

- 6.2 Class flags must be flown on the backstay, or other conspicuous position in the stern of the boat and shall be displayed from the warning signal until the finish has been acknowledged.
- 6.3 Boats may fly the official Interclub Burgee during the Cruise on an appropriate staff or pennant halyard.

7. THE COURSES AND MARKS

- 7.1 The diagrams provided later define the courses and marks to be used. For races 1, 2 and 4 the diagrams define the order in which marks are to be passed and the side on which each rounding mark is to be left. For races 3 and 5 the order of marks to be rounded will be displayed at the stern of the committee boat and the mark rounding direction will be indicated by black letters on a white background indicating port rounding or white letters on a green background indicating starboard rounding.
- 7.2 The committee boat may set a mark (Orange Inflatable Mark 'O') to enhance a windward or downwind start. The committee boat will fly the International code flag 'O' (Oscar) over one of the numeral pennants 1 to 9. The numeral pennant will indicate the distance in nautical miles from the starting area to Mark 'O'. The committee boat will display the magnetic heading to this mark.
- 7.3 Approximate latitude and longitude waypoints have been listed to assist skipper to locate the various marks. It is the skipper's responsibility to locate all marks. Any error in listing the latitude and longitude waypoints cannot be used as grounds for redress.

8. THE START

- 8.1 All races will be started using RRS 26. The warning signal for each succeeding class will be concurrent with the starting signal of the preceding class.
- 8.2 The starting line will be between the R/C flag on the committee boat and the course side of the starting mark.
- 8.3 In the event of light winds the committee boat may fly the 'L' flag (follow me) with one sound and relocate the start to a different location than described in the course diagrams.
- 8.4 A boat not starting within 10 minutes of the last start will be scored 'DNC'. This changes RRS A4 and A5.

9. THE FINISH

- 9.1 The finishing line will be between the R/C flag on the committee boat and the course side of the finishing mark. The finishing mark is NOT a rounding mark and may be on either side of the committee boat.
- 9.2 The committee boat may not be present at the finish line. In this event, skippers should record their finish time and the name and finish time of the next yacht. Boats will report the finish times to the Race Committee within 30 minutes after docking. Finishing mark must be left close abeam (within 3 boat lengths), leaving the mark to port.

10. TIME LIMITS

- 10.1 The time limit to finish Race 1 will be 1700 hrs. (5 PM)
- 10.2 The time limit to finish Race 2 will be 1900 hrs. (7 PM). If the first boat with a positive PHRF rating (higher than zero) does not finish by 1700 hrs. (5 PM) the race will be abandoned.
- 10.3 The time limit to finish Race 3 will be 1700 hrs. (5 PM)
- 10.4 The time limit to finish Race 4 will be 1900 hrs. (7 PM) for Course 1 (to Colborne) and 1700 hrs. (5 PM) for Course 2 (to Mohawk Island Buoy). If the first boat with a positive PHRF rating does not finish Course 1 by 1700 hrs. (5 PM) or Course 2 by 1530 hrs. (3:30 PM) the race will be abandoned.
- 10.5 The time limit to finish Race 5 will be 1500 hrs. (3 PM)
- 10.6 Boats failing to finish within the time limit after any boat sails the course and finishes will be scored DID NOT FINISH. If one boat finishes within the time limit in the fleet, then all classes will be scored. SI 10.6 does not apply if the race is abandoned according to SI 10.2 or 10.4. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.

11. HEARING REQUESTS

- 11.1 A protesting boat must report its protest to the race committee (preferably via VHF Race Channel 79) before leaving the racing area, preferably immediately after finishing the race by giving the name and/or sail number of the protesting yacht and the name and/or sail number of the boat being protested.
- 11.2 All protests shall be lodged with a race committee representative within 60 minutes after the committee boat docks. A Hearing Request Form will be included in the race packet. Protestors may also file their protest electronically using the US Sailing app. Electronic protests should be emailed to dhaller48@gmail.com.
- 11.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearing in which they are parties or named as witnesses. The time and location of hearings will be posted on the official notice board.
- 11.4 Protests entered on the final day of the regatta that do not involve prize winners may be heard after the awards presentation. This is necessary to avoid delay of the presentation.

12. CONDUCT

- 12.1 The Person-In-Charge shall be responsible for the conduct of the crew before, during, and after each race. In the event of serious misconduct (including fireworks, water balloons, and acts of rowdyism), destruction of property, or failure to comply with a request of the Race Committee, Cruise Chair, or instructions from the Dock Master or harbormaster in any Cruise port, the Race Committee or Cruise Chair may request that the Protest Committee resolve the issue in accordance with RRS 69.
- 12.2 Failure for a yacht to comply with dockage assignments in any port as officially communicated by the Interclub Cruise Committee or its port representative may result in the yacht being told to retire from the cruise.

13. SCORING

- 13.1 The scoring system of RRS Appendix A will be used, except as modified below.
- 13.2 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 13.3 A boat's series score will be the total of all of her race scores. This modifies RRS A2.
- 13.4 A boat that started and either retired or did not finish the race shall be scored two more points than the number of finishers in that race. This modifies RRS A5.2.

14. SAFETY

- 14.1 All boats must carry equipment required by the State and/or Country of registration at all times.
- 14.2 All boats shall meet the requirements of the Offshore Racing Council race category #4. The Race Committee strongly recommends (but does not require) that all personnel on deck wear personal flotation when starting without exception. After starting, each competitor is individually responsible for wearing a personal flotation device adequate for the conditions.
- 14.3 The Race Committee reserves the right to inspect any boat for seaworthiness and/or safety concerns and take appropriate action as it deems fit.
- 14.4 All boats must check in with the race committee prior to their warning signal and report the total number of crew prior either via VHF Radio Channel 80 or via text to the R/C chair at 716-491-9558.
- 14.5 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee before leaving the course area via VHF Radio Channel 79. If notification by radio is not possible, the boat should text the R/C chair at 716-491-9558 at the earliest possible opportunity.

15. AWARDS

- 15.1 The Racing Division will have flags awarded for first, second and third place finishes for each race.
- 15.2 The Racing Division will have flags awarded for first, second and third place for the series.
- 15.3 The Interclub Trophy (Buffalo-Courier Express) will be awarded to the best overall boat in the Racing Division.
- 15.4 The Cruising Division will have suitable Interclub awards given for first place in each 3-day series at the conclusion of each 3-day series. There will be no awards for individual races.

16. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

16.1 Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors and other participants sailing in this event are participating entirely at their own risk (see RRS 3, Decision to Race). The race organizers (Organizing Authority, Race Committee, Protest Committee, Host Clubs, Sponsors, or any other Organization or Official) shall not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or personal injury to any competitor or other participant, including but not limited to personal injury or death, sustained as a result of participating in this event. By participating in this event, each entrant agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such entrant's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.


