

2024 BCYC Twilight Race Series
SAILING INSTRUCTIONS – RACE #2

Lake Charlevoix – Friday August 9th- Boyne City Yacht Club – Charlevoix, Michigan

- 1 Rules** — The regatta will be governed by the ‘rules’ as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 2 Notices to Competitors** — Notices to competitors will be distributed to all registered racers via text message.
- 3 Changes in Sailing Instructions** — Any change in the sailing instructions will be posted via email before 1200 hours on the day it will take effect. An alert to these changes will also be sent via text message.
- 4 Signals Made Ashore** — No signals will be made ashore during the race.
- 5 Class Flags and Starting Sequence**

- 6 Racing Area** – Lake Charlevoix as indicated on the Course Sheet.
- 7 The Courses** – Course Sheets are included in each competitor's email and are available at Yacht Scoring.
 - 7.1 The Course Sheet shows the venue, the order in which marks are to be rounded, and the side on which each mark is to be left
 - 7.2 Race #2, August 9th, will feature only one course.
 - 7.3 There is no provision for shortening the course.
- 8 Marks**
 - 8.1 Marks “A”, “B”, “C”, “D”, “E”, “F” will be the typical CYC Wednesday Night white pylon buoys.
 - 8.2 Marks “L” (Loeb) and “S” (Sea-Gull) will be yellow or orange inflatable cylinders anchored in a minimum of 20' of water.
 - 8.3 Marks “D”, “E”, “F”, “L”, and “S” will be lit with white approx 3s flashing strobes.
- 9 The Start**
 - 9.1 Divisions will start in the order of Non-spinnaker, followed by spinnaker
 - 9.2 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the RC Signal Boat at the starboard end and the course side of the “C” mark at the port end.
 - 9.3 A clearance mark may be attached to the rear of the RC Signal Boat and shall be left to starboard.
 - 9.4 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall keep clear of the starting area and of all boats whose warning signal has been made.
- 10 Recalls** – Individual recalls will be signaled in accordance to RRS 29.1. In addition, the Race Committee may attempt to hail On Course Side (OCS) competitors vocally or on VHF channel 69. Failure to be hailed, the timing of such hail, or failure to hear a hail is insufficient cause for redress under RRS 62.

11 The Finish

- 11.1 The finishing line will be between the "F" mark and the Northernmost Corner of the Northwest Marine docks on shore.
- 11.2 There may or may not be a finishing gun.
- 11.3 Race Committee **must** be hailed via VHF channel 69 when a competitor is approximately 1 NM out from the finish line.
- 11.4 In the absence of the RC, boats shall take their own time when passing the finishing mark. This time shall then be reported to the RC within one hour of your finish via text message.
- 11.5 Beware of shallow water on the Port end of the finishing line towards shore.

12 Time Limit – RRS 35 is changed. Time limit for the Twilight Race will be will be 0200 hrs. on August 10th. Boats failing to finish within the time limit will be scored TLE.

13 Protests

- 13.1 A boat intending to protest shall radio the RC by VHF channel 69 upon finishing. Identify the boat name intending to protest and the boat name being protested only. NO other information should be provided at that time.
- 13.2 Protests can be emailed following Friday's race within 60 minutes of your finish to the PRO. Electronic forms may be used and are available on Yacht Scoring under general race forms / US sailing protest form (editable). Electronic forms or photos of the forms can be texted to our PRO at 248-930-2125 or emailed to: augieengelhart@gmail.com.
- 13.3 Protests will be heard in approximately the order of receipt. All protests will be heard at the regularly scheduled BCYC Tuesday Night Race following this race in Boyne City

14 Scoring

- 14.1 Handicap fleets will be scored using the MWPHRF Time-On-Time Method ($TCF=650/[PHRF +550]$) similar to regular season Tuesday Night Scoring.
- 14.2 Boats scored TLE shall be awarded points – number of your division boats that finish plus 1. This changes RRS 35.

15 Safety

- 15.1 Yachts leaving the racing area prior to finishing are requested to advise the RC by VHF channel 69 or text cell phone # 248.930.2125
- 15.2 All boats shall carry a VHF radio
- 15.3 All boats shall comply with the current minimum equipment list required by the US Coast Guard
- 15.4 All boats shall comply with USGC lighting requirements for their vessel. Failure to do so is grounds for protest from competitors or disqualification.

16 Appropriate Conduct – Littering on the race course or in the marina shall be grounds for disqualification.

17 Prizes

- 17.1 Flags will be awarded to yachts in each fleet placing first, second and third for the series

17.2 The awards ceremony will be held at the BCYC season wrap party on Oct. 1 at the Boyne City FOE. All participants are welcome to attend.

18 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY — Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
