

# St. Petersburg Yacht Club Dress Code

The St. Petersburg Yacht Club has a long-standing reputation and rich nautical heritage. To strengthen our steeped history and maintain our shared values, the House and Grounds Committee have established this Dress Code to accommodate and ensure all members feel welcome at *their* club. This Dress Code applies to all members, family members, guests, and children ages 13 and older. Members are responsible for apprising their guests of this Dress Code prior to visiting any Club property.

The following Dress Code descriptions will guide you to appropriate attire for all club spaces. Members or their guests may be denied access or service if improperly attired at any time.

## Items not permitted on any Club Property

- Any dress item with pictures, graphics, or writing that could be offensive.
- Cut offs, ripped jeans, extremely short skirts or shorts.
- All members and guests must remove caps or hats prior to entering any Clubhouse. Ladies may wear dressy hats, but not regular sport hats/caps. Management may make exceptions for special events.
- Gym shorts, sleepwear, male tank tops.
- Bare feet or socks. Footwear must always be worn outside of the pool deck(s).
- Wet Swimwear, outside of designated pool areas.
- "For Sale" and "For Lease" signs, political writings on apparel, political banners, political flags, public causes, advertisements, announcements or solicitations of any nature.

## Dress Code Category Details

- **Resort Casual** – Dress slacks or shorts, high-quality dress denim for all. In addition, for gentlemen a collared or button-down shirt, sport coat also permissible. For ladies, dresses or skirts and dress sandals permitted. Flip flops are not permitted.
- **Casual** – Comfortable, yet refined dress. Shorts, high-quality denim, and flip flops permitted. Swimwear, even with a coverup, is not permitted.
- **Swimwear** – Bathing attire should provide appropriate coverage for an elevated private club atmosphere. Thongs and revealing swimwear of any kind is prohibited.
- **Informal Yacht Club** – Blue blazer, Club tie, white shirt, grey pants or skirt, for gentlemen black socks and black shoes.
- **Yacht Club Formal** – Yacht Club officer jacket, black tie, white shirt, white pants or skirts, for gentlemen white socks and white shoes.
- **Black Tie Formal** – For gentlemen, a tuxedo. For ladies, floor or tea length gowns. Gentlemen and ladies may also wear Yacht Club formal.
- **Black Tie Optional** – For gentlemen, a formal suit or elevated cocktail attire, a tuxedo is optional. For ladies, cocktail, tea, or floor length dresses.
