# SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

#### 1. RULES

- The race will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing. As allowed by RRS 88.2, the US Sailing prescriptions to RRS 63.2 & 63.4 do not apply to this race.
- Boats shall meet all West Florida PHRF class rules for a Category 4 boat as defined therein.
- Boats competing in the Cruising class may deploy a free-flying headsail pursuant to Appendix E, section 2.c of the WFPHRF Class Rules by declaring their intention to do so at the skipper's meeting.

#### 2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

• Competitors that meet the eligibility requirements in the Notice of Race may enter by delivering a completed entry form and paying the entry fee before 1000 on 3 February, 2018.

#### 4. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located adjacent the Davis Island Yacht Club's north staircase.

# 5. CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

 Any changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted within 5-minutes of the conclusion of the Competitors' Meeting.

## 6. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located on the lawn west of the clubhouse. If a
postponement is signaled ashore, the warning signal will be made not less than 45-minutes after flag AP is
lowered.

# 7. RACING AREA

• The racing area is the waters surrounding the Interbay Peninsula including Hillsborough Bay, Tampa Bay, and Old Tampa Bay.

# 8. CLASSES AND CLASS FLAGS

The expected classes and their class flags are....

Spinnaker & Racer Cruiser: White "S" on red background

Non-Spinnaker & Cruiser: White "N" on blue background

Other classes and class flags may be announced at the Competitors meeting.

# 9. COURSE & MARKS

- The course, course length, and course marks are described in Appendix A.
- Should the wind conditions necessitate a postponement prior to the start, the R/C may relocate the starting
  line farther down the course by displaying code flag "L" and motoring towards the next mark. In this case the

starting mark will be either a mark of the course or an orange drop buoy. Any marks of the course passed by the RC while relocating the starting line will be eliminated from the course and the course distance will be recalculated using the relocated starting line and the remaining course marks.

#### 10. STARTING AND FINISH LINES

- Unless the race is postponed pursuant to SI 8-2, the starting line will be between the windward side of the orange flag on the RC boat and DIYC mark "A".
- The finish line will be between the windward side of the orange flag on the RC boat and the nearby finish mark described in Appendix A.

#### 11. PENALTIES

• The scoring penalty pursuant to RRS 44.3 is in effect for this regatta except that if the application of a scoring penalty causes a tie between two boats, the tie shall be broken in favor of the boat which did not take a penalty. This changes RRS 44.3-c.

#### 12. COMMUNICATION

- While on station the Race Committee will monitor VHF channel 72. The Race Committee may also be reached at 813-215-0893
- Competitors shall attempt to hail the Race Committee on channel 72 approximately 5-minutes prior to finishing.

#### 13. TIME LIMIT

• The time limit for the race will be 1700, 3<sup>rd</sup> February, 2018. Boats still racing after the time limit will be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing. This changes rules 35, A4 and A5.

#### 14. PROTESTS

- Boats intending to protest or request redress shall notify the Race Committee of their intent to protest at the finish.
- The time limit for filing protests is 20-minutes from the RC docking time.

# 15. SCORING

Scores will be calculated using West Florida PHRF RLC ratings.

#### 16. AWARDS

- Classes will receive awards based on the number of entrants as described in the NOR.
- Please see Appendix B for the location of the Awards and after race party.
