NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

The regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, including appendix V2 (post-race penalty).

2. ELIGIBIITY AND ENTRY

- **2.1** The regatta is open to all boats with a valid WFPHRF certificate and any One-Design class, over 20-feet in length, with four or more entries.
- **2.2** Classes may be divided based on the number of entries.
- **2.3** Boats in classes with fewer than 4 entries will be placed in the appropriate WFPHRF Class/Division.
- **2.4** Under West Florida PHRF rules, this is a Category 4 event for the distance course and Category 5 for Spinnaker Class.
- 2.5 Cruising spinnakers are permitted for the Cruising Class. All Cruising Class boats intending to use a cruising spinnaker must declare so no later than 1900, January 12th either by email to fleetcaptain@diyc.org or by informing the registration desk staff between 1700-1900 on January 12th.
- **2.6** Boats may enter on-line at www.diyc.org. Boats may also enter, in person, at DIYC between 1700 and 1900 on January 12th.
- **2.7** Entry must be made online by January 7th to avoid the late fee.
- **2.8** No entry will be accepted after 1900, January 12th.

3. FEES

All boats. \$75. plus FL sales tax.

Late Fee: Entries received and paid after January 7th must add

\$15.00 plus FL sales tax Entries by non-members of US SAILING

must add \$5.00 plus FL sales tax.

Entry fee includes dockage, camping, keg beer (Saturday & Sunday after racing) and dinner Saturday night (2 tickets).

Extra Dinners can be purchased on the entry form for \$14.02 plus FL sales tax.

5. SAILINGINSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions may be available on the DIYC website by January 6th, and at the competitors' meeting. Distance-race courses will be determined and posted on-site by 0930 each day.

6. THE COURSES

- 6.1 Racer-Cruiser, Non-Spinnaker, Multi-Hull and Cruising will race distance races in Tampa Bay using fixed marks one race per day.
- 6.2 Spinnaker and One-Design classes will race on drop-mark courses in Hillsborough Bay, as many races as possible depending on time and weather conditions.

7. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 7.1 All PHRF classes will use the Scoring Penalty of rule 44.3.
- 7.2 One-Design classes, except Melges-24s, will use the Two-Turns Penalty of rule 44.1.
- 7.3 For Melges-24s, the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

8. SCORING

8.1 All handicap racing will be scored TOD using West Florida PHRF

- 8.2 When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 8.3 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

9. HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

PHRF boats shall not be hauled out during the regatta except with written permission of the race committee.

10. PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded based on entries received by January 12. Prizes will be awarded in each division for first place, if three boats; top two, if five boats; top three, if seven or more boats.

11. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
