#### 13 Change of Course after the Start

Except for shortening the course, there will be no change of course after the start.

# 14 The Finish

- 14.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a race committee boat and the finishing mark.
- 14.2 If the Race Committee is not on station, the US Sailing Prescription to RRS 34 shall apply. Skippers taking their own time shall deliver a signed note of their finishing time to the Race Committee immediately upon docking. Such finishing times will be posted as soon as possible. Such posting will constitute the beginning of the time limit allowed for redress under RRS 62.2 for that boat.

# 15 Alternative Penalties

Only the scoring penalty, RRS 44.3, will apply.

## 16 Protests

- 16.1 A yacht intending to protest SHALL REPORT IMMEDIATELY AFTER FINISHING TO A MEMBER OF THE RACE COMMITTEE on the far side of the committee boat from the finish line, clearly identifying the infringing yacht and await acknowledgment. This changes RRS 61.
- 16.2 A yacht acknowledging an infringement and having complied with RRS 44.3, shall report in the same manner as in 16.1 above clearly identifying the yacht infringed against and await acknowledgment.
- 16.3 Protests shall be written on forms available from the Race Committee and lodged with the Race Committee at the committee boat within <u>one hour</u> after the time of the docking of the Race Committee boat; except on Sunday the protest <u>may</u> be filed <u>on the water</u> within one hour of the protesting boat's finish.
- 16.4 On Friday and Saturday all protests filed will be posted on the Official Notice Board within one-half hour of the protest deadline. On Sunday, the parties to the protest will be notified via email or telephone.
- 16.5 We will attempt to hear protests filed on Friday and Saturday right after the protest time limit. All unresolved protests & protests filed on Sunday will be heard on Tuesday, April 17, 2018 starting at 1900 in the Regatta Room on the first deck of Davis Island Yacht Club.

# 17 Scoring

- 17.1 The low point scoring system, Appendix A of the racing rules, will apply, with three races scheduled for all classes, except that each yacht's total score will be the sum of her scores for all races. One race shall be completed to constitute a series.
- 17.2 Corrected times will be calculated by the PHRF time-ondistance method.

## 18 Haul-out Restrictions

After her starting signal on the first day of racing, no yacht shall be hauled out of the water without the written permission of the Race Officer or the Regatta Chairman.

#### 19 Prizes

- 19.1 Prizes will be awarded to the top three finishers in each division.
- 19.2 The Bonanni Trophy shall be awarded to the overall winner of the PHRF Spinnaker Class.

#### 20 Retiring Yachts

Retiring yachts are requested to inform the Race Committee as soon as possible. VHF Channel 63 will always be available for such communications.

#### 21 Courtesy Announcements

Courtesy announcements of such things as postponements, premature starters, protest deadlines, and other signal displays and notice postings may be announced over VHF channel 63. Such announcements will be strictly a courtesy and used as a means to call attention to the proper notice or display. The failure or inability to receive or the failure to transmit such announcements shall not be grounds for redress.

# 22 Disclaimer Of Liability

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

# Appendix A Caution About Mark 25' Priv

A few weeks ago, Mark 25' Priv, as described in Appendix B below, was knocked down by a barge. It has been replaced by a large piling and a white buoy located approx. 50' to the east. The picture to the right shows these marks as viewed looking south, the same view seen by the competitors approaching the marks. It has been reported that the white buoy is anchored to the base of the old tower.

The physical description of 25' Priv is as follows: This mark consists of the large piling *and* the white buoy located to the east of the piling as well as a 10' wide zone around both marks and the area between them. Boats may not enter the zone around the marks or pass between them. When rounding, everything is left to Starboard.
