NOTICE OF RACE September 2 - 4, 2011

The Officers and Members of the Stamford Yacht Club invite you to participate in the 77th Vineyard Race starting Friday, September 2, 2011, at Flashing Red Bell "32" (the "Cows") off Stamford Harbor. The First Signal is scheduled for 1200. The Stamford Yacht Club is the Organizing Authority for this event.

1. RULES and OTHER REQUIREMENTS:

Racing will be governed by:

1.1 The 2009-2012 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS). If there is one-design racing and there is a conflict between Class Rules and the RRS, Class Rules shall apply. The US SAILING Prescriptions to the RRS do not apply, except the prescriptions to RRS 61.4, 68, 76.1, 76.3 and Appendix F.

(a) Rule 41 is hereby modified to allow Double-handed entrants to communicate amongst themselves via VHF radio while racing.

1.2 (a) For the Vineyard Race course - The current ISAF Offshore Special Regulations for a Category 3 event, except that the life raft need not have a canopy. These regulations are available on the ISAF web site: (www.sailing.org). A copy of these regulations shall be kept aboard while racing. In the event of a conflict between these regulations and applicable class rules, the class rules shall apply. The US SAILING Prescriptions to these regulations do not apply.

(b) For the Cornfield Point and Seaflower Reef courses - Minimum Equipment & Safety Recommendations of the YRA of Long Island Sound for *Category B*. A copy of these regulations is available on the YRA web site at www.yralis.org.

1.3 (a) For IRC classes: the current IRC Rule Parts A, B, & C. The crew limit shall be the number on the certificate plus one. IRC boats equipped and rated with water ballast and/or canting keel may use same. This modifies RRS 51.

(b) For PHRF classes: the PHRF Regulations of the YRA of Long Island Sound.

(c) In accordance with IRC Rule 21.6.1(b), without an increase in rating, a boat may carry one more spinnaker than shown on her current certificate, if of area not greater than rated SPA.

(d) The number of crew allowed shall be the number stated on the certificate plus one. The crew weight shall not exceed 85kg multiplied by the Crew Number printed on the certificate, plus one.

1.4 Each boat shall carry an operating VHF radio capable of transmitting and receiving on Channel 05 and a cell phone, the number of which shall be on file with the Race Committee.

1.5 **Transponders** - Each boat will be required to carry a transponder. They must be picked up during the hours posted for each boat to pick up Sailing Instructions and must be returned to Vineyard Race headquarters at the Stamford Yacht Club within 4 hours of finishing the Race. Each boat will be required to enter into a transponder security agreement which will require a credit card deposit. The transponders are provided to the participants at no additional cost. There will be a link on the

Vineyard Re section of the Stamford Yacht Club web page (www.stamfordyc.com) which will allow anyone with web access the ability to track the progress of the race.

2. ADVERTISING:

2.1 In accordance with Rule 80, this is a Category A event.

2.2 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

3. ELIGIBILITY and ENTRY:

3.1 The Vineyard Race is open to single-hull and multi-hull boats owned by or chartered to members of yacht clubs or organizations affiliated directly or through regional associations with US SAILING. The provision for US Sailing affiliation is waived for boats of foreign registry.

3.2 Boats that meet the following additional requirements may enter this race:

- (a) All single-hull boats must have a length overall of 29 feet or longer. Multi-hulls must have a minimum length of 27 feet.
- (b) Boats may race IRC if they have a valid IRC certificate. IRC boats rating 1.080 or higher (faster) must have an Endorsed certificate. Boats racing for the Northern Ocean Racing Trophy (NORT), the Double-handed Ocean Racing Trophy (DH-ORT) and/or the Gulf Stream Series Trophy must have Endorsed certificates.
- (c) Boats may race PHRF for the Vineyard Race course if their PHRF rating (YRA of LIS distance rating) is 123 seconds/mile or faster. The New England Lighthouse Series (NELS) is dedicated to PHRF boats rating 90 and higher (slower).
- (d) Boats electing the Seaflower Reef Course must have a PHRF rating from 69 to 135 (YRA of LIS distance rating).
- (e) Boats electing the Cornfield Point Course must have a PHRF rating from 99 to 189 (YRA of LIS distance rating).
- (f) Cruising Boats - Boats rated PHRF 99 seconds/mile or faster may sail on the Vineyard Course, with spinnaker, provided it is tacked at the stem with no longer than a 3' line. Spinnaker poles and bow sprits of any kind are NOT permitted. Such boats will race at their YRA-LIS Spinnaker Rating.
- (g) Classic Boats - Boats entering the Classic Boat Division must have a PHRF rating (YRA of LIS distance rating) 189 seconds/mile or faster. For Classic Boats with a PHRF rating higher than 123, the boat must have a minimum overall length of 35 feet. A Classic Boat is defined to be a boat having a hull built prior to 1986.
- (h) Multi-hulls will race with NEMA ratings on the Vineyard Race Course.
- (i) Mini-650 or Mini Transat Class boats with a minimum crew of two (2) are permitted.

3.3 Youth Challenge Entries:

- (a) Shall be sponsored by a USSailing recognized yacht club or community sailing organization as evidenced by an entry form signed by a flag officer or authorized representative of the organization.
- (b) Shall meet requirements of the PHRF fleet
- (c) The crew must consist of a minimum of:
 - (1) two adults, one of whom must be designated as the Captain;
 - (2) More than half of the crew shall be individuals who have reached their 14th birthday but not their 19th birthday prior to August 26, 2011.
- (d) All Youth competitors shall have attended a Junior Safety-at-Sea program and have otherwise qualified in accordance with the JSA of LIS Big Boat Program requirements.

3.4 All entries are to be made on-line via the link on the Stamford Yacht Club website <http://www.Stamfordyc.com>, by selecting the link to Sailing, the Vineyard Race and then "On-line entry Forms" or directly on YachtScoring at www.yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eID=483. To avoid late entry fees, entries must be completed *no later than Friday, August 19th*. The Race Committee reserves the right to reject any entry.

3.5 Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Race Committee.

4. ENTRY FEES:

4.1 The Entry Fee will be as follows:

To determine the applicable Entry Fee, a boat's LOA is to be rounded downward to nearest lower whole number. (e.g: 39.71' = 39')

4.2 Fees for non - US SAILING members, add \$25 to each of the above.

4.3 No refunds will be given after August 27th.

4.4 Late fees: after August 20th = 1.5X the above. After August 27th = 2X the above.

4.6 Overall entries are limited to 150.

5. DIVISIONS & CLASSES: There will be IRC, PHRF Spinnaker, and Multi-hull (NEMA) Divisions for the Vineyard Course. There will be PHRF Spinnaker and Non-Spinnaker Divisions for the Cornfield Point and Seaflower Reef courses. There will be a special PHRF Classic Boat Division (Vineyard Course) competing for the Bounding Home Trophy which may overlap with the PHRF Division. Classes will be formed under the Divisions based upon the number of entries.

6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS: A representative from each boat shall report to the Race Committee room at the Stamford Yacht Club between 1800 and 2200 on Thursday, September 1st or between 0900 and 1300 on Friday, September 2nd, to receive Sailing Instructions, scratch sheets, transponder (if utilized) and any other final instructions. Sailing Instructions will also be available at www.yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eID=483. The Sailing Instructions shall incorporate and supersede this Notice of Race.

7. COURSES:

START: Flashing Red Bell "32" (The Cows) off Stamford Harbor.

FINISH: Immediately northerly of the entrance to Stamford Harbor, between the Signal Boat and Green Beacon "3" on the easterly end of the westerly breakwater.

The Vineyard Race course: From the Start to the Buzzards Bay Light Tower, leaving the Tower to starboard, then leaving Block Island to starboard, then leaving Flashing Red Bell "32" (The Cows) to starboard, then to the Finish, leaving Nun "2" to starboard for a total of 238 NM.

Note: In extreme heavy weather and at the discretion of the Race Committee, a short course may be signaled by displaying Code Flag "S" prior to the warning signal for the start of any class. The short course will be the Seaflower Reef Course.

The Cornfield Point Course: From the Start to Cornfield Point Shoal leaving Red Bell "2" to starboard, then leaving Flashing Red Bell "8" (at the easterly end of Long Sand Shoal) to starboard, then leaving "CF" MO(A) buoy to starboard, then leaving Flashing Red Bell "32" (The Cows) to starboard, then to the Finish, leaving Nun "2" to starboard for a total of 116 NM.

The Seaflower Reef Course: From the Start to 'Seaflower Reef' leaving the reef to starboard, then leaving R/W "PI" to starboard, then leaving Flashing Red Bell "32" (The Cows) to starboard, then to the Finish, leaving Nun "2" to starboard for a total of 143 NM.

8. PENALTIES: The Scoring Penalty, rule 44.3 will apply.

9. SCORING

- 9.1 PHRF classes will use YRA of LIS distance ratings and will be scored using time on distance.
- 9.2 The IRC classes will be scored by using the IRC Time Correction Factor using time on time.
- 9.3 Teams will be scored by using the average of each team member's percentage placement in its respective class.

10. PROTESTS: A Protest Committee appointed by the Organizing Authority will decide protests. Protests involving potential trophy winners will be heard at Stamford Yacht Club as soon as practicable after the boats involved have finished. Protests for other boats will be heard beginning at 1400 on Sunday, September 4, 2011. Special arrangements will be made for boats finishing later than that time.

11. COMMUNICATIONS:

- 11.1 The Race Committee may make announcements via VHF Channel 05.
- 11.2 Except in an emergency, a competitor shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not simultaneously available to all boats. Except as specifically requested by the Race Committee, this restriction also applies to mobile phone.

12. PRIZES:

- 12.1 **The Vineyard Race is a mandatory qualifying race for the Northern Ocean Racing Trophy (IRC), the Double-handed Ocean Racing Trophy (IRC) and the New England Lighthouse Series (PHRF).** Awards within each class as well as perpetual trophies, including the Vineyard Trophy, Northern Ocean Racing Trophy, New England Lighthouse Series Trophy, Nirvana Trophy, and the Bounding Home Trophy for best classic yacht will be presented at the Awards Presentation and Reception, which will be held on Sunday, September 4, 2011 at 1800 at the Stamford Yacht Club. All participants in the Race as well as their families are invited.
- 12.2 The Vineyard Race is a qualifier for the Caper, Kings Point, Mertz and Sagola season trophies awarded by the YRA of Long Island Sound, and the IRC Gulf Stream Series. The Vineyard Race is also a qualifier for the Stamford Trophy Series awarded at the SYC Annual Awards Dinner.

13. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY: Competitors participate in the event entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race. It is the sole responsibility of the Skipper/Owner of each boat to see that she is seaworthy in all respects and that she is manned by a competent crew. The Skipper/Owner and all the members of the crew of each boat, by participating in this Race, agree to do so at their own risk, and waive any claim against and hold harmless the Stamford Yacht Club, its officers, directors, committees, members, employees and agents against any claims arising in any way out of the participation in the Vineyard Race (including all courses) and related activities of such boat, her Skipper/Owner and crew.
