NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)*.
- 1.2 Sonar Class Association Appendix B - Alternative Rules will be in effect. In addition, whisker poles are allowed. Spinnaker poles are not permitted.
- 1.3 International 2.4mR Appendix K class rules will apply.
- 1.4 Racing rules listed below will be changed as indicated. The changes will appear in full in the sailing instructions, which may also change other rules.
 - a. The US Sailing Prescription to Rule 40 will not apply and the preamble to Part 4 will be changed to require PFD use, dock to dock. A U.S. Coast Guard approved personal flotation device, or in the case of overseas competitors, a personal flotation device approved by their Government's corresponding Maritime Authority, shall be worn, properly fastened, at all times, while launching and sailing, except while temporarily adding or removing clothing.
 - b. The first two sentences of rule 44.1 are changed to: 'A boat may take a One-Turn Penalty when she may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 or rule 31 in an incident while *racing*.'
 - c. The US Sailing Prescriptions to Rules 63.2 and 63.4 will not apply.
- 1.5 Appendix T shall apply.
- 1.6 In case of a conflict between Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions, the Sailing Instructions shall govern. This changes RRS 63.7.

2 ADVERTISING

- 2.1 Advertising shall conform to the current World Sailing Regulation 20.
- 2.2 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority in accordance with World Sailing Regulation 20.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to 2.4mR, Freedom Independence 20 and Sonar class sailboats.
- 3.2 All sailors with disabilities are eligible to compete.
- 3.3 Singlehanded entry is open to both sailors with disabilities and able-bodied (AB) sailors in the 2.4mR class.

- 3.4 Doublehanded entry is open to sailors with disabilities in the Freedom Independence 20 class. An AB sailor will be provided for each Freedom Independence 20 by the organizing authority and will perform non-tactical duties. AB sailors will rotate throughout the regatta as scheduled by the organizing authority.
- 3.5 Triplehanded entry is open to not less than one sailor with a disability in the Sonar class.
- 3.6 The helmsman of each boat shall be a member of his or her national authority. The U.S. national authority is US Sailing. Proof of membership will be required.
- 3.7 Eligible competitors may enter by completing the entry form on the JGASF website. JGASF@juddgoldmansailing.org
Competitors using equipment provided by the Judd Goldman Adaptive Sailing Foundation (JGASF) shall complete an equipment waiver.

4 BOATS

- 4.1 Boats (2.4mR, Freedom Independence 20 and Sonar) with appropriate adaptations are provided by the JGASF for competitor use. Competitors may also supply their own boat.
- 4.2 The organizing authority may require the JGASF provided boats to be rotated and such rotation may be listed daily.
- 4.3 All teams using boats provided by the JGASF shall post a damage deposit with the JGASF in the amount of \$500.00. This deposit will be collected by the JGASF at registration.

5 FEES

- 5.1 Required fees are as follows:

7 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be provided at registration and may be available on the website.

8 VENUE

- 8.1 The regatta will be held at the Event Tent adjacent to the Judd Goldman Sailing Center at Burnham Harbor, 1362 S. Linn White Drive, east of the intersection of Lake Shore Drive and E. McFetridge Drive, Chicago, IL (one block west of the Adler Planetarium).
- 8.2 Racing will be on Lake Michigan, east of the Burnham Harbor entrance.

9 THE COURSES

The courses will be described in the sailing instructions.

10 SCORING

- 10.1 One completed race will constitute a regatta for a class.
- 10.2 When a class has completed five or fewer races, a boat's regatta score will be the total of her race scores. When her class has completed six or more races, a boat's regatta score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. This changes rule A2.

11 BERTHING

All boats shall be kept at the Burnham Harbor docks as directed by regatta officials.

12 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

Boats shall not be hauled out during the regatta except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the race committee.

13 RADIO COMMUNICATION

While racing, and except in an emergency, or as directed by the race committee, a boat shall neither make nor receive transmissions by radio, mobile telephones or other electronic devices that are not available to all boats.

14 PRIZES

- 14.1 Awards will be presented to the first, second and third place boats in each class at the conclusion of racing on Sunday, July 29, 2018.
- 14.2 The winning competitor in the 2.4mR class will receive the Independence Cup Singlehanded Trophy, which will be appropriately engraved and will remain on display at the JGASF.
- 14.3 The winning team in the Freedom Independence 20 class will receive the Independence Cup Doublehanded Trophy, which will be appropriately engraved and will remain on display at the JGASF.
- 14.4 The winning team in the Sonar class will receive the Independence Cup Triplehanded Trophy, which will be appropriately engraved and will remain on display at the JGASF.
- 14.5 The Kristi Walker Sportsmanship Trophy will be awarded to the regatta participant who best exemplifies the ideals of good sportsmanship both on and off the water during the regatta, as determined by the regatta competitors. The trophy will be appropriately engraved and will remain on display at the JGASF.
- 14.6 The Pete Paganis/Bill Parks Most Improved Trophy will be awarded to the team or individual who, in the opinion of the regatta committee, comes to the regatta with the least amount of sailing experience and gives the best overall performance. The trophy will be appropriately engraved and will remain on display at the JGASF.

15 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race. The Organizing Authority and Committee will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, prior to, during or after the regatta. A waiver shall be signed by all competitors and shall be considered one of the documents governing the regatta.
