## NOTICE OF RACE

#### 1 RULES

- 1.1 Racing shall be governed by the rules as defined in the current Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 PHRF N competitors may use double headsails.
- 1.3 Neither spinnakers nor double headsails are permitted in the Hospice Classes.
- 1.4 Entrants with racing experience are not permitted in the Hospice Class NOVICE. Boats that host a caregiver and/or have a junior sailor at the helm are eligible to race in the Hospice Class NOVICE
- 1.5 SAFETY: The US Sailing SER "Nearshore Safety Equipment Requirements" apply and confirm or supplement the USCG requirements and the Racing Rules of Sailing except as amended by specific class association rules.

## 2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

2.1 Classes expected to participate include:

Hospice Class (LIGHT, HEAVY & NOVICE) CRCA – ORR-Ez - Racer Cruiser CRCA – ORR-Ez - Non Spin CRCA – ORR-Ez - Performance Cruiser PHRF (A, B, C, N)

- o does not qualify for CBYRA high point.
- 2.2 Additional classes will be accepted upon the receipt of three (3) or more paid entries by 2000 hours on Wednesday, 11 September 2019.
- 2.3 The entry fee is:
  - \* \$60 for early entries received by 2000 hours on Saturday, 7 September.
  - \* \$20 Late Fee for entries received after 2000 hours on Saturday, 7 September, but before 2000 hours on Wednesday, 11 September 2019.
  - \* Entries received by Friday, 30 August will receive 1 free Shore Party ticket.
- 2.4 This is a charity event and all proceeds from entry fees will be donated to hospice charities. Refunds will not be granted for cancelled registrations or race cancellation.
- 2.5 Registration will be available online at the SCC website https://scc1944.clubexpress.com\_or https://yachtscoring.com\_.

- 2.6 For the Hospice classes only, there will be a Skippers Meeting at the tent at Bert Jabin Yacht Yard on Friday 13 September 2019 at 1730 hours. Pursuit starting times will be available.
- 2.7 If you want to be considered for prizes given for Juniors and/or caregivers being on or sailing your boat, email or call in the details of your crew to info@hospicecup.org before 1200 hours Friday 13 September so your eligibility can be noted on the entry list.

#### 4 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions for each course will be available on the regatta website no later than Saturday, 31 August 2019. Amendments may be posted on the YachtScoring event website no later than 2000 hours on Friday, 13 September

#### 5 VENUE

- 5.1 Racing will be on the Severn River and on the adjacent waters of the Chesapeake Bay.
- 5.2 Fleet assignments, rendezvous locations, and starting order will be defined in the Sailing Instructions.
- 5.3 A post-race party at the Bert Jabin Yacht Yard will be held after the conclusion of racing.

#### 6 COURSES

- 6.1 The Harbor 20 class will sail one or more drop mark races on the Severn River, south of channel SE of mark "HP". **Area "1"**
- 6.2 The CRCA, PHRF, Cal 25, & Hospice classes will sail one (1) race using CBYRA Region 3 Annapolis Area standard racing marks. **Area "2"** (short or long course)
- 6.3 All other classes will sail one or more drop mark courses as shown in the Sailing Instructions.

## 7 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 7.1 For the PHRF (A,B,C,N) & One-Designs (J-105,J-80, J-35, Alerion 28, Harbor 20) classes only, RRS 44.1 is changed so that when a rule of Part 2 is broken outside the zone at a mark, and there is no injury or damage, and no significant advantage is gained, the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty. This changes RRS 44.1.
- 7.2 For all other classes (Hospice classes & CRCA classes), RRS 44.3 is to be used. This scoring penalty requires that a yellow flag be flown and the Race Committee be notified. No turns are required.

## 8 SCORING

RRS Appendix A4, the Low Point System, will apply. A boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. This changes RRS A2.

#### 9 PRIZES

9.1 Prizes in each class will be as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> place for 3 entries, 2<sup>nd</sup> /6, 3<sup>rd</sup> /9 etc. and one for every 3<sup>rd</sup> additional entry.

9.2 Additional prizes will be awarded as described in NOR # 12, Additional Information. Special overall trophies funded by large sponsor pledges to hospices will be presented. Best overall performing skipper in the three (3) most recent Hospice Cup events will receive an invitation to compete in the 2020 Hospice Regattas National Championship.

#### 10 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in Hospice Cup entirely at their own risk; see RRS 4. The organizing authority will accept no liability for material damage, personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the event.

## 11 INSURANCE

Each boat shall be insured with valid third party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$300,000.

#### 12 ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- 12.1 This is a Clean Race. All competitors are strongly encouraged to use multi-use water bottles instead of disposable water bottles, and to recycle whenever possible. RRS 55 prohibits placing trash in the water.

**Hospice Cup**, a unique charity regatta, is a cooperative effort of Hospice Cup, Inc, The Sailing Club of the Chesapeake, Storm Trysail Club and Chesapeake Racer Cruiser Association, and multiple hospices serving the Maryland, D.C., and Northern Virginia areas where most racers live and work. The participating hospices benefit from funds raised through sponsorships, sailing crews, Shore Party ticket sales, and the live and silent auctions.

**The Race** counts for CBYRA High Point, attracting many of the best sailors on the Bay and requiring of racers only that they submit an entry and pay the fee. Non-racers and cruising sailors can enjoy a great day on the water, on spectator boats or in the special Hospice Class B (for novice racers), and at the festive post-race party.

**Racers can be Sponsors.** Sponsorship is not required of racers, but by donating or raising money for participating hospices and hospice care, racers earn incentives including Shore Party tickets for crew or other guests. The Hank Lawton Trophy for fundraising is presented to the crew that raises the most money before race day, with prizes also for 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> places. **Social events** include the post-race Shore Party held at the Bert Jabin Yacht Yard with music, live and silent auctions, family-friendly activities, a catered dinner, and trophy presentations. Early entries received by Friday, 30 August 2019, will receive one (1) free Shore Party ticket. Racers may purchase discounted tickets in advance, or qualify to win tickets by participating in the sailor fundraising program. See website <a href="http://www.hospicecup.org">http://www.hospicecup.org</a>. Commemorative items such as t-shirts and hats are available by advance order and at the Shore Party.

**Sponsored trophies** are underwritten by multi-year pledges from corporate or individual sponsors. Trophies include:

- The Hospice Cup is the top honor awarded for best three-year performance; it qualifies the winner to compete in the annual Hospice Regattas National Championship against representatives of the many other hospice regattas sailed nationwide, each event patterned on this original hospice regatta.
- New in 2018-Annapolis Triple Crown Charity Trophy-This trophy is a partnership between the Leukemia Cup, CRAB Regatta and Hospice Cup. Racers must participate in each of the three charity regattas AND fundraise. Trophy is awarded in October to the sailor who finished best in class AND is the highest fundraiser overall.
