

Notice of Race
36th Annual Junior Powder Puff Regatta
Metedeconk River Yacht Club
Friday July 12, 2019

1. Rules

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS). Appendix S will apply.
- 1.2 RRS 61 is changed to require a competitor to inform the race committee's finish boat of her intention to protest, including the sail number of the protested boat, immediately after finishing.
- 1.3 RRS 63.7 is replaced with: "If there is a conflict between a rule in the notice of race and one in the sailing instructions, the sailing instructions shall apply."

2. Eligibility and Entry

- 2.1 The regatta is open to International Optimist Dinghies, skippered by girls 8 to 15 years of age at the time of the first race, and also Club 420's, FEVA RS, Laser Radials, Laser 4.7's, and Sunfish, skippered and crewed by girls who have not reached their 19th birthday, in the calendar year.
- 2.2 Entry to the regatta will be limited based on the first 250 contestants to register.
- 2.3 Eligible boats may enter by completing the registration form found online at <https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eID=6224>
- 2.4 For Reference to Optimist fleets by age at Junior Powder Puff Regatta 2019, please see Addendum 2.

3. Registration Fees

- 3.1 The required fees are \$75.00 for single-handed boats, and \$150.00 for double-handed boats.
- 3.2 The fee includes breakfast and lunch, and exclusive Powder Puff Bear and a commemorative Powder Puff bag for all contestants. All contestants will receive complimentary chances for the raffle tables.
- 3.3 Registration after June 30, 2019 is subject to an additional late fee of \$20.00.
- 3.4 On site registration fee, if space is available, will be an additional \$25, \$50 for double-handed boats.
- 3.5 Cancellations received by June 30, 2019 will receive refund in full.
- 3.6 Late Entry Registrations are not guaranteed a Powder Puff Bear or commemorative Powder Puff bag.

4. Schedule

Friday July 12, 2019
0800 to 0915 Check In: Clubhouse
0930 Contestant's Meeting
1030 First Warning Signal for All Classes, races to follow.
Multiple Races are scheduled for all Classes. A lunch break will be given. One race constitutes a regatta.

5. Sailing Instructions

- 5.1 Sailing Instructions will be available on line and at check-in.

6. Venue

The racing area will be on the Metedeconk River. See Course Chart.

7. Courses

The courses used will be windward/leeward, triangle, modified Olympic and Course 2. See Addendum 1.

8. Scoring

The low point scoring system of Appendix A will apply. If more than three races are completed, each boat's worst score will be excluded from her series score. This changes Rule A2.

9. Support Boats

9.1 Support boats will not be allowed to launch using the dinghy ramp or hoists after 0700 on July 12. All those launching before 0700 will have to move their car and trailer to a designated area to allow for access to the ramp and hoists.

9.2 All support boats shall register with the Organizing Authority before the end of registration.

9.3 Team Leaders, coaches and all other support personal shall not enter the racing area during the period beginning 3 minutes before the start of any race and ending after the finish of the last boat, or when the RC signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.

9.4 For Optimist Blue/Red, one coach boat per team of ten (10) sailors will be allowed but must keep well clear of any boat that may be racing.

9.5 All support boats shall comply with instructions from the Race Committee.

9.6 All support boats shall obey requests of Official Safety Boats, relating to the location of Support Boats with respect to competitors. The Race Committee may request assistance from Support Boats without any penalty. This changes Rule 41.

10. Prizes

10.1 Awards will be made to all individual fleets, including green fleet, commensurate with the number of entrants.

10.2 All green fleet participants will receive a participation medal.

10.3 The Jr. Powder Puff Sportsmanship Award is presented to a participant who in the judgment of the Jr. Powder Puff Committee, instructors and race committee has shown outstanding dedication and graciousness, in the sport of sailing.

10.4 The Founders Award is presented to the top Metedeconk River Yacht Club sailor.

11. Responsibility for Safety

Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, and any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race officers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
