

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

- 1.1. This race will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing except the US Sailing prescription to rule 34 (see Instruction 8).
- 1.2. The measurement rules and ratings will be PHRF Spinnaker, Non-Spinnaker and Double-Handed rules and ratings as administered by the YRA of LIS.
- 1.3. Boats will be scored using the <u>Distance Racing Handicap</u> issued by the YRA of LIS and scored using time-on-time.
- 1.4. All boats must comply with the YRA of LIS Category C minimum equipment recommendations.
- 1.5. All boats shall carry VHF radio able to send and receive on Channel 16, 22A and 71.
- 1.6. Per rule 42.3(i), a boat that runs aground while racing may use its engine or any other method to get refloated provided the boat does not gain a significant advantage in the race.
- 1.7. Each boat shall fly from her backstay a numeral pennant corresponding to her class.

2. DOUBLE-HANDED FLEET RULES

- 2.1. Crew limit is two persons, one of whom must be 18 years of age or older
- 2.2. Boats will be scored using the double-handed racing handicap issued by the YRA of LIS and scored using time-on-distance.
- 2.3. Wind vanes or electric self-steering devices may be used.
- 2.4. Jack lines must be rigged both port and starboard, and run from the cockpit to the bow.
- 2.5. Safety harnesses must be worn at all times while racing.

3. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS, CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS & SCRATCH SHEETS

- 3.1. Notices to competitors will be posted online at the yachtscoring.com event site.
- 3.2. Changes to these Sailing Instructions will be posted by 0900 on the day of the race online at the yachtscoring.com event site.
- 3.3. Once on station, the signal boat will signal if a change was made to the Sailing Instructions after Friday, May 31, 2019 by displaying Code Flag L. Any change will be available from the Race Committee (RC) Signal Boat.



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3.4. Scratch sheets may be obtained from the NYAC YC office Saturday morning, June 1 or online at the yachtscoring.com event site.

4. COURSES

- 4.1. Divisions and course letters will be displayed by placards on the Race Committee Signal Boat course board.
- 4.2. Course distances have been determined by the Regatta Committee and are not subject to redress. This amends RRS 62.1(a).
- 4.3. Courses are described in Appendix A.

5. THE START

- 5.1. The starting mark will be Can 1 (40o 53.468N/ 073 o 44.151W).
- 5.2. The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the RC Signal Boat and the course side of the starting mark.
- 5.3. Prior to the Warning Signal of the first division, all boats shall sail past the stern of the RC Signal Boat while on starboard and be recognized by the Race Committee.
- 5.4. Five minutes before the first scheduled Warning Signal, the Race Committee will display Code Flag F (Attention Signal) with a sound signal. Code Flag F will be removed one minute before the warning for the first start. This changes RRS 26.
- 5.5. The Warning Signal for Division 1 is scheduled for 1200 hours. The start for Division 1 is scheduled for 1205 Hours. The Starting Sequence is detailed in Appendix B.
- 5.6. Succeeding classes will be started in numerical order either (a) at five-minute intervals by displaying a Class Flag at the Start of the preceding class, or (b) at any time afterward by recommencing a new five-minute sequence. In the event a new five-minute sequence is initiated, the Race Committee will announce the time of the next Warning via VHF 71 and will endeavor to make a multiple Horn Signal shortly before the new Warning Signal.
- 5.7. A yacht that starts later than 10 minutes after her starting signal will be scored DNS, without a hearing. This changes RRS A4 and A5.

6. RECALLS

The Race Committee will attempt to hail OCS boats on VHF Channel 71. Failure of the Race Committee to successfully notify an OCS boat over the radio shall not relieve the OCS boat of its responsibility under RRS 28.1 nor be grounds for redress.



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7. FINISH LINE

7.1. The finish line will be between a staff displaying an Orange Flag on a RC Signal Boat and the course side of the finish mark. Unless the course is shortened, the finish mark shall be the starting mark (see 5.1).

8. TAKING TIME AT THE FINISH

- 8.1. In the absence of a Race Committee boat at the finish line, boats shall take their own time when, passing within 20 yards due North of Can "1" as described in Section 7.1.
- 8.2. This time is to be reported to the NYAC Yacht Club at 917-488-3234.

WITHDRAWALS

Boats withdrawing from the race are to contact the Race Committee either over VHF Channel 71 or by contacting RC at 914-830-5366.

10. FILING & HEARING PROTESTS

- 10.1. A protesting boat shall follow requirements outlined in RRS 62.1 (a) and shall notify the Race Committee, at the time it finishes, that it intends to file a protest and which competitor(s) she is protesting.
- 10.2. The protest time limit ends 90 minutes after the last boat in a protesting boat's class has finished. All protests shall be delivered to the NYAC YC Office and marked to the attention of the Protest Committee. Emailed protests are acceptable. Notices will be posted no later than 60 minutes after the protest time limit has expired to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. This Notice will also include the time and place of the protest hearing.

11. PRIZES

- 11.1. First, second and third place prizes will be awarded in each division. Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Race Committee.
- 11.2. If possible, prizes will be awarded immediately following racing at the post-race get together at NYAC YC. Alternatively, prizes will be awarded at the NYAC YC Annual Awards Dinner.

12. RESPONSIBILITIES OF COMPETITORS

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.



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13. TIME LIMITS

The time limit for the first boat in its class to sail the course and finish in each class will be 4 hours from the starting time of that class. Boats failing to finish within 1 1/2 hours after the first boat finished in its class will be scored DNF without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.
