

CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

Lake Erie Interclub Cruise,

Welcome aboard mates to the 62nd running of the Annual Lake Erie Interclub Cruise. I must admit I missed last year's event, but I think my crew has forgiven me. I know they will be happy to get back on the board for the adventure to follow. Again, the committee has put together another Super Event! Let me assure you the leadership is strong. We have been spoiled for many years with a race committee following the fleet around the course. That was great on light air days when they would motor us in the morning till the air came up or shortened the course. Not sure how this will all turn out but times have changed. I would like to thank Bill Lasher (EYC) for stepping up to be the race committee pro. I can tell you he has run many regattas in Erie



and has done a super job, buy him a beer. I have been doing this event off and on since my teenage years. Back then those dinghy regattas were also fun and challenging. I recall coming home from one in Toronto, looking out on the lake knowing the fleet was up in Dover having a beautiful day of sailing wondering if I made the right decision ... On one of those early trips in 1973 I was 15 (see sailing instructions enclosed), I recall a race from Port Maitland Ontario to Erie. Back then we got most of our weather forecast from NWS/NOAA. I can't recall how the day started but everybody stayed on starboard to cross the lake. The wind was out of the SW a beat all the way. The wind built, we were sailing a C&C 30 with the #3 and a double reef. It was pretty much survival time for most of the day. As we got closer to the south shore, we noticed the bigger boats appeared to be standing more upright and decided to tack back out ... crazy like we didn't need any more wind and we got it. Shortly after that tack we were hit what I now know as a micro burst. The whole boat just shook like crazy, as a kid, I thought the rig was going to fall apart and watching the jib just flopping violently waiting for the moment when it was going to rip to shreds but it didn't. Both sails made it. I didn't want to leave the cockpit in those conditions to take down a sail thank you Dina mo Dave. I later noticed we forgot to put pins in the turnbuckles, the low side shrouds were very loose, so I volunteered to go forward, and hand tighten them, so we could now safely tack. As we were coming in to the finish, we see Bob Ways Masker a 69' Chance under motor its main mast buckled about 34 way up. We later heard that their wind interments peaked around 75 knots and that the winds were from tornadoes in Ohio ... (prayed a lot that day and kissed the ground when we got back in). The lessons ... put those pins in.

REGATTA PERSPECTIVE

The Lake Erie Interclub Cruise was created 62 years ago to provide a challenging series of Lake Erie port-to-port races for cruising and racing auxiliary sailboats, and to allow sufficient opportunity for the membership of participating clubs to have fellowship while enjoying the best tradition of competitive yacht racing. Suitable trophies and keeper awards are presented to winners in every race.

Today, the Lake Erie Interclub Cruise is a well-known event, raced by boats from the United States and Canada. The series provides five days of fun and exciting sailboat racing, as the yachts race from port to port. In addition, the regatta provides ample time to experience the hospitalities of the participating clubs, as well as to discover the wonders of each port.

The Lake Erie Interclub Cruise is raced under the Performance Handicap Racing Formula for Lake Erie (PHRF-LE) run under the auspices of the United States Sailing Association. The regatta is open to racing and cruising auxiliary sailboats.

Back in 1957 after years of races to Port Dover from Erie, a group of sailors from Erie and Buffalo organized a challenging series of Lake Erie port-to-port races for cruising and racing auxiliary sailboats. This cruise provides members of participating clubs with corinthian fellowship while racing and cruising in eastern Lake Erie. Since 1957 the Lake Erie Interclub Cruise has grown into the premier cruise on the Great Lakes. Its five day point-to-point program is open to any member of a USSA or CYA Yacht Club. The Interclub Cruise Burgee symbolizes our cruise. The burgee represents the spirit of American and Canadian friendship and participation of the Host Clubs and annual cruise participants. The three stars symbolizes the founding members of the cruise, the Buffalo Yacht Club, the Buffalo Canoe Club, and the Erie Yacht Club. The Interclub Cruise burgees are available at registration.

CRUISE DIVISIONS

The Interclub Cruise offers two fleets of sailing. Whether you are an avid racer or just cruising, we have a category for you, your family and crew.

<u>The Racing Fleet Division</u> is composed of 5 classes of Yachts divided by rating under the Performance Handicap Racing Formula for Lake Erie (PHRF-LE) run under the auspices of the United States Sailing Association.

The Cruising Fleet Division is open to any seaworthy auxiliary yacht that wishes to enter the Interclub Cruise and abide by the Sailing Instructions. The Fleet is open to all yachts (Sloop, Ketch, Yawl, Multi-hull) without spinnakers, jennickers, etc. Boats participating in the 62nd Anniversary Cruising Division Founder's Trophy series will sail with the Racing Division using a PHRF-LE Non-Spinnaker Fleet racing handicap. The Cruising Fleet will have two Series events. The first event will include the Race 1, Race 2 and Race 3 combined score. The second event will include Race 3, Race 4 and Race 5 combined score.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Customs and Immigration Requirements

As required by Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative, U.S. citizens and nonimmigrant aliens from Canada entering the United States by land or sea are required to present a valid WHTI-compliant document, which include:

- Passports
- U.S. Passport Cards
- Enhanced Driver's Licenses
- Trusted Traveler Cards (NEXUS, SENTRI, or FAST)
- Military Identification Cards (for members of the U.S. Armed Forces on official orders)
- U.S. Merchant Mariner Documents (for U.S. citizens on official maritime business)

Children: U.S. and Canadian citizen children under age 16 arriving by land or sea from a contiguous territory may present an original or copy of his or her birth certificate, a Consular Report of Birth Abroad, a Naturalization Certificate, or a Canadian Citizenship Card.

Boaters who belong to the various trusted travler programs i.e. NEXUS/SENTRI, SVRS (Small Vessel Reporting System) or I-68 may telephonically clear otherwise you will need to utilize one of the four videophones in Erie. Note: SVRS must be sure to file and activate their float plan before leaving. Please call the Erie Port Office 814-833-1355 for more information.

2019 LAKE ERIE INTERCLUB CRUISE

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS / RACING DIVISION / CRUISING DIVISION

1.RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2 The current PHRF-LE class rules shall apply to all yachts in the Racing Division. The Cruising Division will have their PHRF Handicaps assigned by the Race Comittee.

2. NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice boards. Refer to respective race pages for specific notice board locations.

3. CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 2200 on the day before it will take effect.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed in the vicinity of the host clubhouse/building.
- 4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced by 'not less than 1 hour' in the race signal AP.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

5.1 Dates of racing:

- 5.2 Racing Divisions will sail three point-to-point races and two local races (Erie and Long Point Bay course races). Cruising Division C1 will sail the first three races. Cruising Division C2 will sail the last three races.
- 5.3 The scheduled time of the warning signal for each class is shown on the individual course descriptions.

6.CLASS FLAGS

6.1 Class flags will be as follows:

- 6.2 Class flags must be flown on the backstay, or other conspicuous position in the stern of the boat, and shall be displayed from the warning signal until the finish has been acknowledged.
- 6.3 Boats may fly the official Interclub Burgee during the Cruise on an appropriate staff or pennant halyard.

7. THE COURSES AND MARKS

- 7.1 The diagrams provided later define the courses and marks to be used. For races 1, 2 and 4 the diagrams define the order in which marks are to be passed and the side on which each mark is to be left. For races 3 and 5, no later than the warning signal for the first class, the order of marks to be rounded will be displayed at the stern of the committee boat and the mark rounding direction will be indicated by a red (for port) or 'G' signal code (for starboard) flag.
- 7.2 Approximate latitude and longitude waypoints have been listed to assist skipper to locate the various marks. It is the skipper's responsibility to locate all marks. Any error in listing the latitude and longitude waypoints cannot be used as grounds for redress.

8. THE START

- 8.1 All races will be started using RRS 26. The warning signal for each succeeding class will be concurrent with the starting signal of the preceding class.
- 8.2 The starting line will be between the R/C flag on the committee boat and the course side of the starting mark. The committee boat may be on either end of the line.
- 8.3 A boat not starting within 10 minutes of the last start will be scored 'DNC'. This changes RRS A4 and A5.

9. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

9.1 To change the next leg of the course (only applicable for Race 1), the race committee will move the original mark (or the finishing line) to a new position.

10. THE FINISH

- 10.1 The finishing line will be between the R/C flag on the committee boat and the course side of the finishing mark. The finishing mark will be left to port.
- 10.2 The committee boat may not be present at the finish line. In this event, skippers should record their finish time and the name and finish time of the next yacht. Boats will report the finish times to the Race Committee within 30 minutes after docking. Finishing mark must be left close abeam (within 3 boat lengths), leaving the mark to port.

11. TIME LIMITS

- 11.1 The time limit to finish Race 1 will be 1700 hrs. (5 PM)
- 11.2 The time limit to finish Race 2 will be 1900 hrs. (7 PM)
- 11.3 The time limit to finish Race 3 will be 1700 hrs. (5 PM)
- 11.4 The time limit to finish Race 4 will be 1900 hrs. (7 PM) unless the course is shortened at Mark C (Mohawk Buoy), in which case the time limit will be 1700 hrs. (5 PM)
- 11.5 The time limit to finish Race 5 will be 1500 hrs. (3 PM)
- 11.6 Boats failing to finish within the time limit after any boat sails the course and finishes will be scored DID NOT FINISH. If one boat finishes within the time limit in the fleet, then all classes will be scored. (This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5).

12.PROTESTS

- 12.1 A protesting boat must report its protest to the race committee (preferably via VHF Race Channel 79) before leaving the racing area, preferably immediately after finishing the race by giving the name and/or sail number of the protesting yacht and the name and/or sail number of the boat being protested.
- 12.2 All protests shall be written on US Sailing protest forms (included in the race packet) and lodged with a race committee representative within 60 minutes after the committee boat returns to dock.
- 12.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearing in which they are parties or named as witnesses. The time and location of hearings will be posted on the official notice board.
- 12.4 Protests entered on the final day of the regatta that do not involve prize winner may be heard after the awards presentation. This is necessary to avoid delay of the presentation.

13.CONDUCT

- 13.1 The Person-In-Charge shall be responsible for the conduct of the crew before, during, and after each race. In the event of serious misconduct (including fireworks, water balloons, and acts of rowdyism), destruction of property, or failure to comply with a request of the Race Committee, Cruise Chair, or instructions from the Dock Master or harbormaster in any Cruise port, the Race Committee or Cruise Chair may request that the Protest Committee resolve the issue in accordance with RRS 69.
- 13.2 Failure for a yacht to comply with dockage assignments in any port as officially communicated by the Interclub Cruise Committee or its port representative may result in the yacht being told to retire from the cruise.

14.SCORING

- 14.1 The scoring system of Appendix A will be used, except as modified below.
- 14.2 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 14.3 RRS A4.2 is modified as follows:

| DNF (Did Not Finish) | (Finishers + 2) Pts |
| DNC (Did Not Compete) | 88 Pts |

14.4A boat's series score will be the total of all of her race scores. This modifies RRS A2.

15.SAFETY

- 15.1 All boats must carry equipment required by the State and/or Country of registration at all times.
- 15.2 All boats shall meet the requirements of the Offshore Racing Council race category #4. The Race Committee strongly recommends (but does not require) that all personnel on deck wear personal flotation when starting without exception. After starting, each competitor is individually responsible for wearing a personal flotation device adequate for the conditions.
- 15.3 The Race Committee reserves the right to inspect any boat for seaworthiness and / or safety concerns and take appropriate action as it deems fit.
- 15.4 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee before leaving the course area via VHF Race Channel 79. If notification by radio is not possible, the boat should text the PRO at 814-490-6989 at the earliest possible opportunity.

16.AWARDS

- 16.1 The Racing Division will have flags awarded for first, second and third place finishes for each race.
- 16.2 The Racing Division will have flags awarded for first, second and third place overall.
- 16.3 The Interclub Trophy (Buffalo-Courier Express) will be awarded to the best overall boat in the Racing Division.
- 16.4 Prizes will be awarded to the top three boats for each 3-day Cruising Division series at the conclusion of each 3-day series. The Founder's Trophy will be awarded to the winning Cruising Division boat of the Erie to Port Dover Race on June 24.

17.DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

17.1 Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors and other participants sailing in this event are participating entirely at their own risk (see RRS 4, Decision to Race). The race organizers (Organizing Authority, Race Committee, Protest Committee, Host Clubs, Sponsors, or any other Organization or Official) shall not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or personal injury to any competitor or other participant, including but not limited to personal injury or death, sustained as a result of participating in this event. By participating in this event, each entrant agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such entrant's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.








The "Jim Rhoads Lake Erie Interclub Award"


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
