SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS) and the current International Melges IC37 (IMIC37) Class Rules.
- 1.2 US Sailing Prescriptions to RRS 63.2 and RRS 63.4 are deleted.
- 1.3 All competing boats shall carry a handheld VHF radio for safety purposes and Race Committee communication.
- 1.4 In accordance with IMIC37 CR H.3.2, this event is classified as an A Regatta.

2 COMMUNICATION: NOTICES, ANNOUNCEMENTS, VHF CHANNELS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board located at the New York Yacht Club Sailing Center and may also be posted on the event website at <https://nyyc.org/2019-melges-ic37-national-championship>.
- 2.2 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 hours on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 hours on the day before it will take effect.
- 2.3 In addition to the signals made in SI 3.3, the Race Committee will confirm the rendezvous locations as described in SI 6 at 0900 over VHF Channel 72. The failure to make this announcement or for a boat to hear this announcement will not be grounds for a boat to request redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 2.4 The Race Committee will communicate with the fleet on VHF Channel 72.

3 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 3.1 Flag signals will be flown from the western yardarm of the flagpole at Harbour Court.
- 3.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 60 minutes" in race signal AP. This changes RRS Race Signals.
- 3.3 Signals designating the rendezvous location will be displayed at 0900 each race day from the flagpole at Harbour Court.

- 4.2 Eight (8) races are planned. One race constitutes a series. Up to 4 races may be sailed each day on Friday and Saturday. Up to 3 races may be sailed on Sunday. This changes IMIC37 CR H.3.4.
- 4.3 When more than one race will be held on the same day, the warning signal for each succeeding race will be made as soon as practicable.
- 4.4 On the final day of the regatta, the initial warning signal for the final race will not be made after 1500 hours. The warning signal for a start following one or more general recalls may be made after 1500.

5 CLASS FLAG

The class flag will be a white flag with the IC37 logo.

6 RENDEZVOUS

Circle rendezvous locations are listed below and will be designated as described in SI 2.3 and SI 3.3. See SI Addendum A – NYYC Primary Race Areas.

Rhode Island Sound:

- Area “A” -in the vicinity of 160° M and 1.2 NM from R “2” QR Whistle marking Brenton Point

North of Newport Bridge:

- Area “R” -in the vicinity of 200° and 0.5 NM from Halfway Rock
- Area “T” -in the vicinity of G “7” QG off Quonset Point

7 CHECK-IN AND RETIREMENT

- 7.1 **Check-in on Land:** Each yacht shall check in at the registration desk at the NYYC Sailing Center at Harbour Court during the registration times so designated in the notice of race.
- 7.2 **Check-in on Water:** Prior to the warning signal for the first race, each boat shall check in with the Race Committee signal boat in their rendezvous area by passing astern and announcing their sail number.
- 7.3 Boats retiring shall inform the Race Committee on VHF channel 72 or by calling the NYYC Sailing Office at (401) 845-9633 as soon as reasonably possible.

8 THE COURSES

- 8.1 The diagrams in Attachment B show the courses, including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 8.2 No later than the warning signal for each race, the course to be sailed will be designated by displaying a numeral pennant 4 or 5 from the Race Committee vessel.
- 8.3 No later than the warning signal for each race, the Race Committee will display on a board the approximate compass bearing and distance of the first leg.
- 8.4 Mark 2s/2p is a gate. In the event one of the gate marks is missing, the single remaining mark shall be rounded to port.
- 8.5 Mark 1a is an offset mark adjacent to mark 1.
- 8.6 Mark LM is a limit mark set 5-8 boat lengths to leeward of mark 1 with the intention of keeping boats away from the port-tack layline. Mark LM shall be left to port on both the upwind and the downwind legs. However, in Course 5, Mark LM may be passed on either side on the final upwind leg approaching the finish line. The location of the mark LM or the failure of the Race Committee to set the mark LM shall not be grounds for a boat to request redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

9 MARKS

- 9.1 Original marks 1, 1A, and 2S/2P will be yellow inflatable buoys.
- 9.2 Mark LM will be a pink inflatable buoy. During a change of course, as provided in SI 12, mark LM will remain pink.
- 9.3 The starting mark will either be an anchored Race Committee boat displaying an orange flag or a green inflatable buoy.
- 9.4 The finishing mark will be a green inflatable buoy.
- 9.5 New marks, as provided in SI 12, will be orange inflatable buoys.

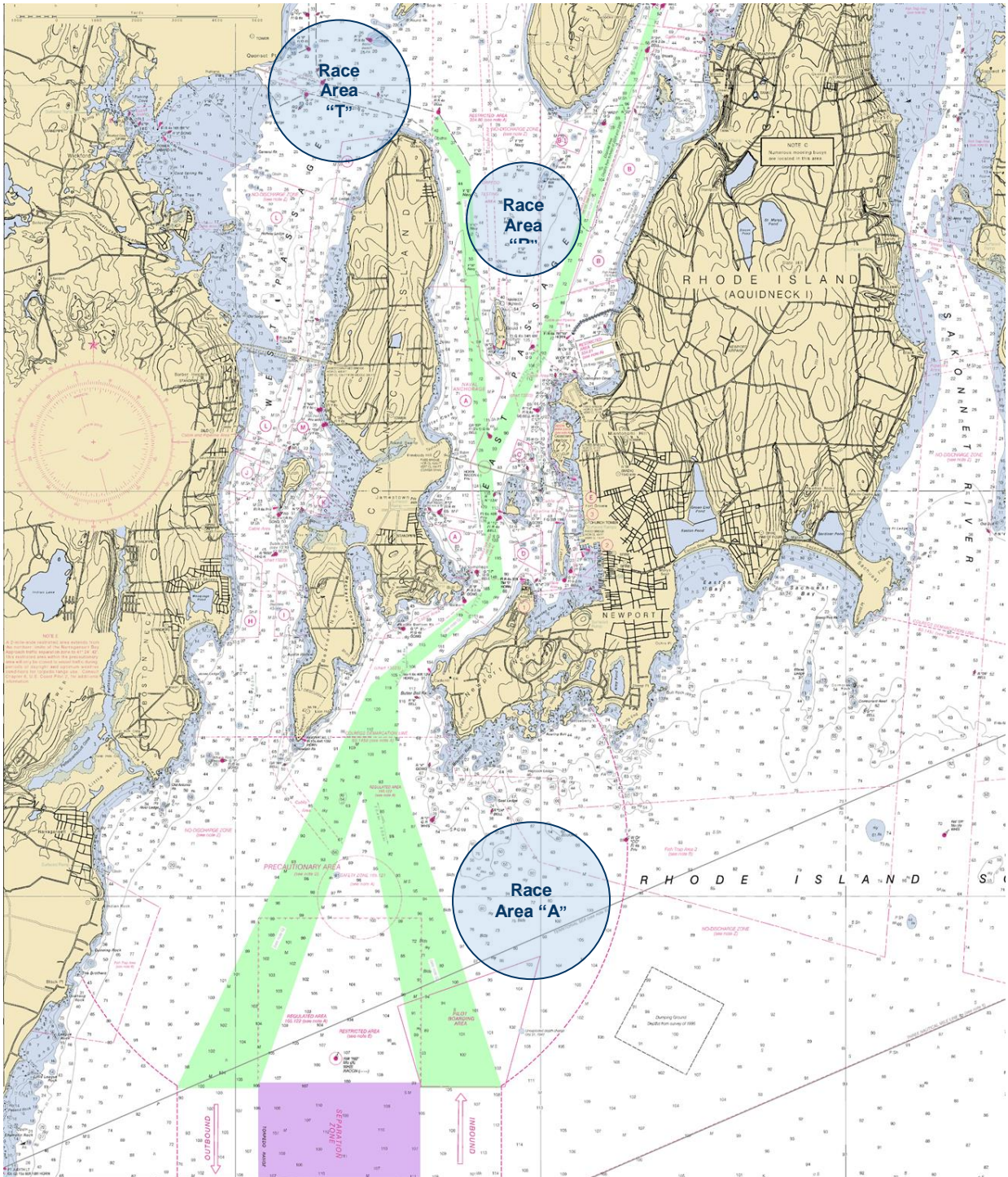
10 THE START

- 10.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the starboard end signal boat and the starting mark.



- 10.2** A boat starting later than five minutes after the starting signal will be scored DNS. This changes RRS 63.1, A4.1 and A.5.
- 10.3** The Race Committee will attempt to notify OCS boats by radio on the VHF channel. Failure of equipment, failure to hear a hail, delay in hailing or the order in which hails are given will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 11 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE**
- 11.1** To change the next leg of the course, the Race Committee will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line to a new position) and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.
- 11.2** The Race Committee may change the course by up to five degrees in bearing and/or 0.2 nm in length without a signal or change of mark color. This changes RRS 33.
- 12 THE FINISH**
- 12.1** The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on a Race Committee vessel and the course side of the finish mark.
- 12.2** The same Race Committee vessel may or may not start and finish each race.
- 13 PENALTY SYSTEM**
- 13.1** RRS 44.1(a) is changed so that the penalty shall be a one-turn penalty including one tack and one gybe.
- 13.2** The protest committee may impose penalties less than disqualification (DPI) for violation of the class rules and racing rules other than those of Part 1 and Part 2. This changes RRS 64.1(a).
- 14 TIME LIMITS**
- 14.1** The time limit for the first boat to sail the course and finish will be three hours from the starting signal.
- 14.2** If no boat has passed the first windward mark 45 minutes after the starting signal, the race shall be abandoned.
- 14.3** Boats failing to finish within 30 minutes after the first boat sails the course and *finishes* will be scored Did Not Finish. This changes RRS 35, A4.1 and A.5.
- 15 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS**
- 15.1** Protest forms may be filed online through the event website or at the Protest Committee Secretary Desk in the New York Yacht Club Sailing Center. Protests shall be delivered to the Protest Committee Secretary within one hour of the docking time of the Race Committee signal boat after the last race of the day. This time will be posted on the Official Protest Committee Notice Board. This changes RRS 61.3 and RRS 62.2.
- 15.2** Notices will be posted as soon as possible to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties. Protest hearings will take place at the NYYC Sailing Center as soon as possible after the notices are posted. The Protest Committee will attempt to hear protests in the order of receipt. Representatives of boats who are parties to a hearing shall remain on call in the vicinity of the protest rooms.
- 15.3** Notices of protests by the Race Committee, Technical Committee or the Protest Committee will be posted within the protest time limit on the Official Protest Committee Notice Board to inform boats under RRS 61.1(b).
- 15.4** When a boat has been involved in an incident that may be subject to protest, it is her responsibility to check the protest notices at the end of the protest filing time to see if she is cited in a protest. Failure of any boat to appear when called for a hearing will be considered by the Protest Committee as grounds for proceeding under RRS 63.3(b).
- 15.5** Breaches of SI 7 and SI 17 will not be grounds for protest by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a).
- 15.6** On the last scheduled day of racing, a request for redress based on a protest committee decision shall be delivered to the Protest Committee Secretary no later than 30 minutes after the decision was posted. This changes RRS 62.2.
- 15.7** On the last scheduled day of racing, a written request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered to the Protest Committee Secretary in accordance with RRS 66. If no races are held on the last scheduled day of racing, the written request shall be delivered within one hour after racing has been abandoned. This changes RRS 66.

- 15.8** Video and photos taken from support and/or coach boats, or spectator boat shall not be used as evidence at protest hearings. This changes RRS 63.6. The penalty for infringing this rule shall be assessed at the discretion of the event protest committee. This rule is not intended as a deterrent to social interaction before and between races.
- 16 SCORING**
- 16.1** One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 16.2** When fewer than six races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When six or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. This changes RRS A.2.
- 17 SUPPORT PERSONS AND BOATS**
IMIC37 Class Rule H.4 applies.
- 18 PRIZES**
- 18.1** Overall series trophies will be awarded to the top five (5) finishers.
- 18.2** Other trophies may be awarded at the discretion of the Organizing Authority.
- 19 WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY**
- 19.1** Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The Organizing Authority, New York Yacht Club, and any official sponsors will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta. Attention is also drawn to RRS 46 and USSER 1.2, Responsibility.
- 19.2** As a condition of entry, each owner, skipper and individual participating crew member shall submit an online liability waiver/media release. The fully executed Waiver and Release of Liability form shall be submitted prior to racing. The waiver form link can be found on the [2019 IC37 National Championship](#) website.
- 19.3** Boats shall not be scored unless the skipper/person-in-charge has submitted a liability & media waiver form.
- 20 SAFETY REGULATIONS**
- 20.1** Restricted Channels: Competitors are reminded that Narragansett Bay and its approaches are considered restricted channels for commercial traffic and other vessels restricted in their ability to maneuver. Competitors must comply with the government right-of-way rules when in proximity to commercial or privileged marine traffic.
- 20.2** Newport Security Zone: In the event there is racing in Narragansett Bay, competitors should be aware of heightened security around the Navy base in Newport just to the north of the Newport Jamestown Bridge. The area may be defined by a series of white buoys marking the Newport Security Zone along the coast of the Naval Facilities from Coasters Harbor to the breakwater at the north end of Coddington Cove and the line defined by the buoys shall rank as an obstruction. Yachts shall not enter this area. A Navy patrol boat monitors the area and vessels navigating in the Exclusionary Zone may face action by Coast Guard and Naval authorities.
- 20.3** Additional Restricted Areas: There may be additional restricted areas due to Navy activity, shipping or fishing operations that may be described in an amendment to the sailing instructions.

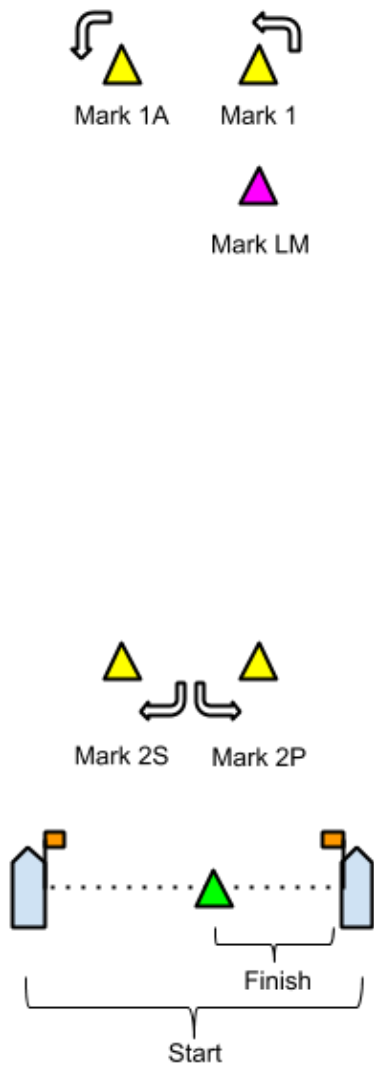
SI ATTACHMENT A – PRIMARY RACE AREAS
