NOTICE OF RACE St. Petersburg Yacht Club 11 Central Avenue

St. Petersburg, FL 33701 March 1 - 6, 2020

1. Rules

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the current *Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)* and the Thistle Class Rules.
- 1.2 As allowed by RRS88.2, the US Sailing prescriptions to RRS60, 63.2 & 63.4 do not apply.
- 1.3 RRS63.7 shall be replaced by, "If there is a conflict between the Notice of Race (NOR) and the Sailing Instructions (SIs), the Sailing instructions shall apply." This changes RRS 63.7.

2. Eligibility

- 2.1 The event is open to all competitors who meet the Thistle Class Association eligibility requirements.
- 2.2 Eligible boats may register by completing the entry form on the St. Petersburg Yacht Club Website at www.spyc.org, click Regattas then scroll to Thistle NOR and Registration, and paying the required fees or going to www.yachtscoring.com and scroll to find this event.
- 2.3 Competitor Registration will be held on Sunday, March 1st, 2020 in the SPYC Regatta Room from 1300 1630. All competitors shall sign a waiver online at Yacht Scoring.

3. Fees

- 3.1 The entry fee is \$250 per boat, for boats entering on, or before, February 17, 2020. The entry fee from the February 18th until the entry deadline on February 26, 2020 is \$300 per boat. Entries after February 26, 2020 MAY BE accepted solely at the discretion of the OA with an explanation note of why, and pay an additional non-refundable late fee of \$50.
- 3.2 The entry fee includes: 5 days of racing, 1 hosted keg party, Shuffleboard Night, 3 Welcome Party tickets, 3 Award Banquet tickets, regatta trophies & 7% FL Sales Tax.
- 3.3 The final deadline for entries will be February 26, 2020.
- 3.4 Boats that entered and withdraw in writing prior to February 18, 2020 will receive a refund of their entry fee less an Administrative fee of \$35. Boats withdrawing after February 18, 2020 will not receive a refund.

5. Sailing Instructions

5.1 Sailing Instructions will be available on line and at check in.

6. Venue

6.1 Boats will be launched from the SPYC Sailing Center on Demen's Landing, 250 2nd St.

SE. The racing area will be on Tampa Bay, east of the St. Petersburg Pier.

7. Courses

The courses may be Windward - Leeward, or Windward - Leeward Triangles.

8. Scoring

- 8.1 The scoring system will be the low point scoring system of Appendix A, except that no score will be excluded.
- 8.2 Three races will constitute a regatta.

9. Prizes

9.1 Prizes will be awarded to skippers and crews placing first through fifth in the A fleet (A fleet includes skippers who have placed eighth or higher in a chevron event), and first through third in the B fleet. The following perpetual trophies will be awarded: Miami Sunshine Regatta Trophy (top finisher overall), Bruce Watters Trophy (top finisher from Florida), Ol' Thistling Tom Trophy (top skipper over 50 years old) and the new_Old Salt Trophy (top skipper 60 years, or older).

10. Electronic Communications

- 10.1 RRS 41 is changed to allow the use of hand held VHF radios, but only for receiving communications from the Race Committee, and in emergencies. Use of any other electronic communication devices, including cellular phones, is prohibited.
- 10.2 The following additional stipulations apply to the Thistle Class Association's Chief Measurer's Ruling 65 and 74: VHF radios may be utilized to monitor weather channels at any time. The Race Committee may communicate safety, or race related information on a designated channel. Competitors are encouraged to monitor the safety channel throughout the race when conditions warrant. Communications between competitors regarding any race information not related to safety is expressly prohibited.
- 10.3 Electronic, or electronic devices, shall not be used except as follows:
- A. Digital electronic compasses are permitted provided that the devices do not have the capacity to provide any information other than the digital compass heading.
- B. Electronic starting timers and stop watches are permitted.
- C. Position sensing devices are permitted provided that the information is recorded or output is not used on board.

11. Disclaimer of Liability

11.1 Competitors participate in this regatta at their own risk. See RRS Rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority, the sponsors, the race committee, officers and board of directors of SPYC, and all those involved in these organizations will not accept any responsibility for material damage, or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after this regatta.
